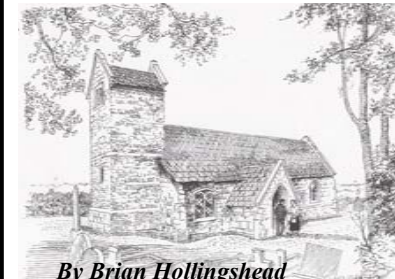

## PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday, 14th June, 7.30 pm in the school.

## SCALFORD CEMETERY—PLASTIC FLOWERS

Whilst the Parish Council has no objection to the display of plastic flowers in the cemetery, some are being placed there and never cleared away, which does not enhance the general appearance of the cemetery. If you do use plastic flowers, would you please ensure they are removed before they become faded and generally weather-worn.

## ONE WAY SYSTEM

The Parish Council continue to be extremely concerned about the traffic problems in Scalford.

One area of concern is the fact that parked cars may one day prevent access to an ambulance or fire engine, possibly putting a life or lives in danger. This was again commented on when a lorry driver recently pointed out the danger to a member of the Parish Council, when he was unable to make a delivery on Sandy Lane.

An equally important worry is the possibility of a serious accident at the bend by the Plough in King Street. Car drivers who approach Scalford from Melton and who are unfamiliar with the area, cannot be expected to make allowances for oncoming traffic to be on the wrong side of the road as they make the turn .... and, as everyone in the area knows, oncoming traffic often has no other option but to **be** on the wrong side of the road at this point, due to the cars parked up to the bend.

Thirdly, there is the inconvenience to residents who find it extremely difficult to exit their own driveways because of parked cars. This has recently caused minor damage to one of their vehicles.

Having again discussed the situation at length at the last meeting, it was felt that a possible solution (seemingly the only solution) would be to create a one-way system in the village. To explore the implications of this further, meetings are being arranged with the Police and the LCC.

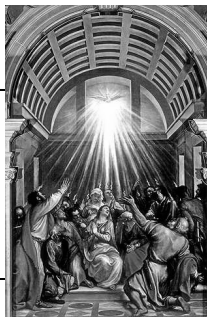

Our book this month was “A Desert in Bohemia” by Jill Paton-Walsh. It is set in the fictional eastern European country of Comenia during the years between the appearance of the Iron Curtain at the end of World War II and the fall of the Berlin Wall.

We were all in agreement that the subject covered was interesting, but the characterisation was poor. It tried to show what it was like for a group of people from different walks of life when communism took over: the Count who lost all; the Countess who left her baby behind; the “normal” people who tried to challenge the suppression of literature and open debate; the idealist; and the power-driven

communist were some of the characters portrayed. We felt this book deserved 4 out of 5 stars, as it was a good attempt at dealing with this period of history.

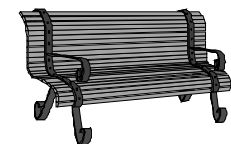

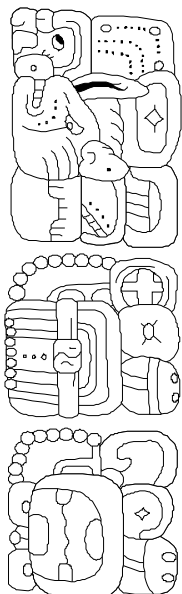
