One such sighting has already been reported, and action has been taken by the police, who contacted the firm's transport manager. The transport manager has now arranged for all the firm's route plans to be re-directed away from Scalford village.

The police have said that if sufficient cases are reported, they will park in the village and stop any offending vehicles. Residents are therefore encouraged to lend a hand, in the expectation that traffic in Scalford can be reduced and traffic flow greatly eased, making the village potentially safer for both drivers and pedestrians.
