

Most Eaton villagers will know that Graham, our postman for some 30 years, reluctantly had to retire earlier this year due to ankle and foot problems. We wanted to show our appreciation for all that Graham did for us over and above the call of duty, and the response to a collection for him was understandably well supported.

Graham came to our September coffee morning and a presentation was made. It was good to see him again, and we were treated to his unique sense of humour once more, which we shall certainly miss.

Graham subsequently put the following piece in the Grantham Journal:

"RETIREMENT

Thank you to everybody in the village of Eaton who gave to my retirement gift and cards, which were presented to me last Wednesday in the village hall. It was good to see many friends I had made over the last 30 years, delivering in Eaton, as well as Croxton Kerrial and the Branston area."

For the first time we are seeing the number of missed appointments, both for the doctors and nurses, put up in reception. This highlights the cost to the practice of a missed appointment. As examples: in August, 17 doctors' appointments and 12 nurse appointments were missed; in September 26 doctors' appointments and 13 nurse appointments were missed. This equates to nearly two days of missed appointments for one doctor.

In the next few months the Surgery will be able to send a text to patients to remind you of your appointment. Please call the Surgery if you cannot attend, so they can offer the time to another patient. Missed appointments until Christmas will be published for information.

Extra appointments. An early morning surgery each Wednesday starting at 7.45 am is to be trialled. There will be 3 pre-booked appointments available before Open Access.

Prescription delivery. Please ask at the pharmacy for details of the expanded village network for collecting prescriptions.

FOODBANKS ACROSS THE BENEFICE

 Λ s the nation continues to struggle $\boldsymbol{\Lambda}$ through the recession, the effect of the downturn in fortunes continues to widen. Ever increasing numbers of people are struggling to make ends meet. As we celebrate Harvest, giving thanks to God for all that he has provided, it is a good time to remember others.

At the October Joint Benefice Service we were joined by Francesca from the Melton Storehouse, which is the foodbank operated by Melton Vineyard church. Francesca was delighted that we as a group of churches care about others and would like to support ping. those who are struggling with increasing food and energy bills, during these increasingly difficult times.

She spoke about how some people found themselves unable to make ends meet, and the help that Storehouse gives, by providing a bag of essentials including three days' worth of food, to tide people over, particularly until a benefit payment comes through. People in real need can access Storehouse through visiting Melton Council, Lunches or their doctors, and explaining their situation; they will either be given a bag immediately or a voucher which can be exchanged for a bag at The Source, Melton Vineyard's shop opposite the Cinema.

There is a clearly labelled box in each church. If you would like to contribute, please pop your contributions into the box. Someone from each church will collect the contributions on a monthly basis and take

them to the Joint Benefice Service, from where they will be taken to The Source, for distribution.

There is also the Trussell Trust Foodbank in Grantham, which works in a similar way: each local church (PCC) will decide where the donations are going (Storehouse or Trussell Trust) and will communicate this throughout their village.

Pot noodles, packet soup, crisps, jams/ spreads, biscuits/snack bars, small bottles of long life drinks.

Main meals

Tinned meat and fish with pull tops, tinned meat in sauce/gravy, small tinned vegetables, dried rice/pasta, packet sauces, dried packet meals, tinned/long life puddings, tinned custard/cream.




