



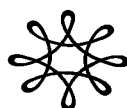

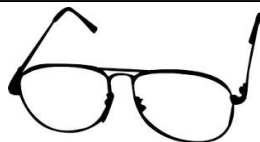

careful about hygiene issues with feeding birds and cleaned their feeders every week. As it is the first time this bird had been seen in this garden, it is highly likely that it had been visiting other gardens and feeders in the area, which could spread the disease if not regularly cleaned.

The trust is calling on everyone who loves feeding birds in their garden to get into the routine of cleaning their feeders regularly, ideally once a week. Infect birds are not always obvious and it is better to be safe than sorry. Simple hygiene routines can allow people to continue to enjoy garden birds without posing any risk to them.

The British Trust for Ornithology is encouraging people to report any instances of suspected Avian pox to them so they can track the disease across the country. They can be contacted at www.bto.org.

A photograph of the bird mentioned here was sent, but it would not come out clearly enough in black and white to be useful.

The Leicestershire and Rutland Wildlife Trust

Is asking people who feed birds in their gardens to be extra vigilant about cleaning their bird feeders after a severe case of Avian Pox was confirmed in Leicestershire.

Avian pox is a skin condition that affects many bird species commonly found in gardens. It causes lesions, particularly on the face of birds which look like warty tumours. In severe cases these lesions grow very large and can affect the bird's vision, which ultimately results in a greater risk of predation or a slow death from starvation.

In this case a Dunnock was spotted in a Cropston garden hopping around under a feeder. The home owner in this case is very



A thanks for Thailand fundraising efforts

To everyone who helped with my fundraising, here is a quick report of my trip, as promised



We arrived, a group of 14, in Bangkok in the early hours of Monday, 30th June, armed with our ruck-sacks, walking boots and plastered in sun cream. After settling into our hostel we had the all-important task of exchanging our money into Thai Baht and budgeting for our trip. Each one of us had the responsibility of being the group leader for every one of the days we were in Thailand, organising everything including our transport, meals and even accommodation.

The main reason for the trip was to visit a foster family and help them in some way to make their lives easier. We travelled directly north from Bangkok to their small farm on the outskirts of the town of Uthai Thani. Our task for the duration of our stay was to build a bamboo hut for the family to sell at market and give their food storage building a wash down and paint. For many of us it was the first time we had done any building work, let alone constructed a hut with the instructions in another language. However, four days later we had built something we could be proud of.

Whilst visiting the foster family we also had the opportunity to experience more of the Thai lifestyle and culture and we taught them of ours. We learnt to cook Thai food, participated in a religious ceremony and even tried to sing along to Thai hymns. We slept in mud huts on the farm which was tough for some of us, as we shared our mats with many unwelcome creepy crawlies, including a giant lizard, centipedes and scorpions! (I don't think many of us slept much). We also went to the local primary school on two occasions where we entertained the children with a collection of English games and songs, including a very poor attempt at singing 'Old McDonald had a farm'.

Our expedition also consisted of two challenging jungle treks through the province of Kanchanaburi. The first was a steep climb of the Erawan falls, a 7 tiered waterfall, and the second a rocky trek across a World War 2 railway line called the Hellfire pass. Both proved very challenging mainly due to the 40 degree heat and humid atmosphere, but we were heavily rewarded by stunning views and the chance to cool off in clear waters.

We then returned to Bangkok for a few days where we visited the Grand Palace and saw many a Buddha. At the end of the trip we were all very sad to leave, but the prospect of a shower, clean clothes and a comfy bed to look forward to was enough to convince us all to board the plane. I was the leader for this final day, which meant that I was in charge of everyone's plane tickets and ensuring that we all made it onto the right flight. Thankfully we all got home safely, so hopefully that means I did my job properly.

Thank you again to everyone who attended my fundraising events and contributed to my trip.
