

t's HARVEST THANKSGIVING TIME AGAIN, and we are

reminded that we have so much to be thankful for - and at the same time our television screens are showing images that shock and confound us as thousands and thousands of ordinary people make the dangerous and difficult journey across the Mediterranean and across Europe in the hope of a better life.

It is easy to react on the extremes of emotion as we see vulnerable people caught up with others whose intent is profiteering for themselves. There is no ready or easy solution, and I don't know about you, but folks I have talked to are alternately worried, angry, compassionate and generous.

I was reminded of a story about a boy and a starfish - and I told this story at the school harvest festivals. You may have heard it before or not - love it or hate it, the story makes a good point and one that I find helpful at this time.

Once upon a time, there was an old man who used to go to the ocean to do his writing.

He walked on the beach every morning before he began his work. Early one morning, he was walking along the shore after a big storm and found the vast beach littered with starfish as far as the eye could see, stretching in both directions.

Off in the distance, the old man noticed a small boy. As the boy walked, he paused every so



often and as he grew closer, the man could see that he was occasionally bending down to pick up an object and throw it into the sea. The boy came closer still and the man called out: "Good morning! May I ask what it is that you are doing?"

The young boy paused, looked up, and replied: "Throwing starfish into the ocean. The tide has washed them up onto the

beach and they can't return to the sea by themselves", the youth replied. "When the sun gets high, they will die, unless I throw them back into the water".

The old man replied: "But there must be tens of thousands of starfish on this beach. I'm afraid you won't really be able to make much of a difference".



The boy bent down, picked up yet another starfish and threw it as far as he could into the ocean. Then he turned, smiled and said: "It made a difference to that one!"

We can all make a small difference if we choose to and many people making a small difference actually makes a big difference, and so we, in the Ironstone Churches, have hatched a plan. Our churches are offering themselves as collecting stations for monetary donations to help the refugees and asylum seekers.

The donations given via the Methodist Churches at Stonesby and Scalford will be sent on via The Methodist World Mission Fund and the donations given via the Church of England Churches (Waltham, Stonesby, Eaton, Eastwell, Goadby Marwood, Chadwell and Scalford) will be sent via Leicester Diocese to Tear Fund and to projects connected to the Leicester City Churches.

The appeal will run through October and anyone is invited to join in by putting their donation into a sealed envelope and then on to the collection plate at any church service or send in an envelope marked "Refugees" to The Vicarage, 23 Melton Road, Waltham on the Wolds, LE14 4AJ, or giving it to someone you know who will take it safely to church or give it to me. You can also give envelopes in at Waltham or Scalford School, but please label carefully "refugee appeal".

If you would like to send a cheque, could I suggest you make the cheque out to your local church and they will process it and send the money on within the appeal. Again, please make sure you put "refugees" on the envelope. *Maybe we could all go without something we like during October and give the money away.*

On 1st November we will be having a joint churches service at Waltham Church at 10.30 am with a guest speaker, Revd Pete Hobson who works with asylum seeker and refugees via Leicester Cathedral. I will ask him to do a Q and A during coffee time if there is enough interest. Let me know if you would like this.
