On Gardens and God

Dear Reader of the Village News,

Do you enjoy gardening? Maybe, like me, you enjoy looking at gardens that have been lovingly cared for, and admire all the gardening skill and hard work that has gone into them. But when it comes to your own 'patch' you are well aware that beautiful gardens like those viewed in the Chelsea Flower Show don't just happen!

As someone who isn't a 'gardener' - cutting the grass or trimming hedges is usually the summit of my gardening achievement - I am certainly daunted by the challenge of the Vicarage garden.

When we moved to Waltham, Mary and I were most impressed by the many lovely ways in which our predecessors, Beverley and David, developed the Vicarage garden over their time. Inevitably, since they moved away last autumn, the garden has started to show signs of neglect, and we now find ourselves beginning to tend it at a time of year when everything is still growing rapidly.

Knowing our limitations - mine more than Mary's! - we have needed to call upon skilled gardening help to assist us, and we know it will take some time and effort before the garden is as it could be.

Perhaps our experience of gardens and gardening can also be a picture of life. Like a garden, our lives have their different seasons - sometimes a period of rapid growth and activity, and at other times a more quiet period where little seems to happen.

Again, like a garden, our lives also need to be carefully worked upon, if they are to flourish. That doesn't just happen but requires care and attention, so that the different plants can grow together in harmony with each other.

At the start of the Bible, we read of how God planted a garden - the Garden of Eden - and gave human beings the task of working it and taking care of it. Despite the mess that Adam and Eve made of this God-given calling through their fateful choice, the call for humans to care for this world still remains; and as part of the 'garden' of God's creation, you and I also need careful cultivating if we are to flourish.

Christians believe it is through Jesus that we come to know just how much God longs to bring true flourishing in our lives. The same Jesus who said this of Himself: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener" (St John's Gospel, chapter 15, verse 1).

May the garden of our lives be open to all that God wants to do in them, and may we be rooted and grounded in the love God has for us in Jesus Christ.

From the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

Several heartbreaking events have happened during the last month; the two terrorist attacks in Mancheser and London and now last week the appalling fire at Grenfell Tower in west London. In all these events, there has been a tragic loss of life, underlined this week with the loss of complete families. When things like this happen a natural response is to ask why? Where is God in this?

The message from the Bible is that God is right there in the midst of it all. In Jesus, we have a God who is not remote, he stands beside us wherever we are and in whatever situation we find ourselves. Jesus himself was no stranger to suffering. We see that most clearly in the last days of his life and in his death on the cross.

During these recent events, there have been stories about unexpected people who were neighbours to people in need: a Muslim taxi driver, taking people home free of charge; and a homeless man, Christopher Parker, helping an injured person after the Manchester bomb; the Australian nurse Kirsty Bowden, who lost her life assisting injured people in the aftermath of the London Bridge incident. In the Grenfell Tower fire, it was the Muslim residents, awake because they were breaking their Ramadan fast, who woke up their sleeping neighbours. There is also a report of how a disabled woman was carried down the stairs by two people she did not know.

Talking to his friends, Jesus said: "When you do anything to help others you are doing it for me - even a little thing like providing a drink and something to eat". Jesus told a story about a despised foreigner, a Samaritan, who went to the help of a traveller who had been attacked on the road between Jerusalem and Jericho, emphasising that sometimes God works through the lives of the most unexpected people.

At the end of his life Jesus left his friends with a challenge to continue to do his work. St Paul, one of the early church leaders, put it this way: he said, in a symbolic but also a literal way, that we are to be Jesus' hands, feet, eyes and ears in the world, doing the things that Jesus would have done - thoughts expressed in Brian Wren's hymn:

When a stranger's not alone, Where the homeless find a home, Praise the love that Christ revealed, Living, working, in our world.

Living in our world today will always be challenging, but God is here with us in our world, even in the most testing of situations and in the most unexpected ways. Do we sometimes fail to see where God is?


