Letter from the Revd Canon John Barr

Questions of life, faith and meaning

Dear Reader of the Village News,

How do you and I try to make sense of life? When we look at what is going on in the world - the conflict and controversy, devastation and division - it can leave us with many more questions than answers. Those of us who believe in God can also wonder where God is to be found in all the suffering and sorrow, horror and heartache that so often overshadow our world, and maybe even our own lives.

Life raises many big questions, and the Christian faith encourages us to explore these. The Alpha Course provides an opportunity to look at the big questions of life, faith and meaning, in a friendly, open and informal setting. It includes a meal, a short DVD and an opportunity to chat with others who also want to explore these questions.

As you will hopefully have already spotted in last month's edition, we shall be running an open-to-all Alpha Course on Wednesday evenings in Waltham, starting with a taster session on 1st November. As someone who hasn't been to an Alpha Course for a number of years, I'm looking forward to taking part, and I warmly commend it to you.

For anyone who wishes to explore how they can make a public commitment to following Jesus Christ within the Church of England, then a service of Confirmation provides a really good way of doing so. Confirmation is a wonderful opportunity for anyone (aged from about 10 to 100) to say their own public 'Yes' to being a Christian.

If you haven't already been christened (baptised), then that can also happen at around the same time as Confirmation.

Early next year - on Sunday, 21st January at 4.00 pm - there will be a Deanery Confirmation Service held at the newly re-ordered St Mary's Melton Mowbray, which will be led by the Bishop of Leicester.

Dear friends,

We are living in very challenging times.

The international situations in the Korean peninsula, the Middle East, eastern Europe and Russia and the British negotiations to leave the EU are creating great uncertainty. Then there are several migration/refugee situations, including those around the Mediterranean Sea and on the Myanmar Bangladesh border. Added to all this is the utter destruction caused by earthquake, storm and flood.

This week (week ending 23rd September) many world leaders have been in New York at the General Assembly laying out their views on what they would like to happen in the world. The American President expressed the principle of America needing to come first and he encouraged other leaders to adopt a similar approach for their countries.

October contains two campaigning weeks which seek to bring the world together. Firstly, the Week of Prayer for World Peace, Sunday 15th to Sunday 22nd October, followed by One World Week from 22nd to 29th October. Both the groups overseeing these weeks draw on people from many backgrounds and faiths.

This year's theme for One World Week is "Mv World depends on Us" reminding us that our personal world is directly affected by what

we do, buy, read, say, consume, vote. How we live will impact on and influence other people's lives in this country and around the world. It means that we don't dump our rubbish on others, pollute their air, exploit workers, let other people face the consequences of climate change without help.

At the heart of Jesus' teaching is the great commandment in which he says we are to love our neighbours as ourselves (Luke 10: 27). The challenge is "What does being a 'good neighbour' mean to you?" The task for us is actively to look out for our neighbours; to make sure their needs are met. This applies both locally and globally.

To do this globally, as well as giving from our own resources, we will need to share with our elected leaders, our vision of a world where all can benefit from the world's resources. In that way, we may be able to help lay the foundations for a fairer and perhaps more peaceful world.






