Letter from the Revd Canon John Barr

We will remember

Dear Reader of the Village News,

During this month, and especially on Armistice Day (11th) and Remembrance Sunday 12th), we join in remembering those who have died in the service of their country. At the heart of each act of remembrance, we observe a two minute silence, which begins with the words "we will remember them".

Yet for all those of us who have been born since the Two World Wars - and who have not been directly involved in any of the more recent conflicts - it is hard to appreciate what it must have been like to be caught up in times of war. Sometimes national commemorations can help us to connect with events of long ago which affected so many lives. For example, at the end of July we were reminded of the huge human cost of war, in the commemoration of an event which took place a hundred years ago on the Western Front, at the Battle of Passchendaele.

Several films have also been released during this year, films that have highlighted some key moments during the Second World War. A few weeks ago, my wife Mary and I went to see the film *Dunkirk*. It retold from three different perspectives - soldiers on land, sailors at sea and pilots in the air - the amazing story of the evacuation at Dunkirk. I found it to be an immensely moving film, and one that reminded me of the stories of those I knew when I served as Chaplain to the Dunkirk Veterans Association in Torbay.

Yet there was one very significant thing that the film did not mention. The situation was so bad that the King called for a *National Day of Prayer* on 26th May 1940. In a national broadcast he asked the people of Britain to pray for God's help. Thousands of special services were held across the country and literally millions of people poured into churches to pray.

Two significant events immediately followed. A storm grounded the Luftwaffe, and a great calm enabled hundreds of tiny boats to cross the channel for the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Forces trapped at Dunkirk. It was the timing of both these events immediately after the *Day of Prayer* which led people to speak of "the miracle of Dunkirk".

Prayer does change things. We may not understand how, but prayer opens channels for God's blessing to be poured out on those who seek the Lord's help. For, as the Psalmist reminds us, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever present help in trouble" (Psalm 46).

The opening days of November are coloured by remembrance.

1st November is the Festival of All Saints, when we remember and celebrate the lives of the saints, known and unknown, who have lived throughout history. It is followed the next day by the festival of All Souls when we remember the lives of all the faithful who have died.

On 5th November some still remember a not very nice part of English history, the 'Gunpowder Plot' with bonfires and fireworks.

On 11th November and on the second Sunday of November we remember soldiers and civilians who have fallen in two world wars and many conflicts since.

Remembering is an on-going theme within the Jewish and Christian faiths. At Passover the Jews remember how their ancestors left Egypt over 3000 years ago. Christians are also challenged to remember in several ways. We remember Jesus' death on Good Friday and his rising on Easter Day every time we

share the bread and wine at Communion, and in our prayers we are called to remember other people and their needs.

Christians are not only encouraged to remember peoples' needs in prayer, but also to see if they can provide answers to some of those prayers. A central part of Jesus' teaching was the importance of remembering the needs of others. The passage below from Matthew 25 is one that regularly makes me think about the way I live:

"For I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. I was sick, and you cared for me I was in prison, and you visited me". (Matthew 25:35-36).

The message Jesus gave to his friends was that every time we do even a small thing for others, we are doing it for him. As we enter this time of remembering, let us always be ready to remember the needs of others in our loving, caring way.

We did learn from the project and will probably make adjustments to the locations where we are monitoring traffic if we repeat the scheme. The County Council have been in touch asking for more volunteers from the village if we want to take part in a similar scheme next year. We have had some interest from residents, but more is definitely needed. It an be as little as an hour of your time and it can make a big difference to people's awareness of the fact that we are a community, not just a cut-through.
