"This year April Fools Day and Easter Sunday fall on the same day. One celebrates fake news. The other marks a true event". I'm quoting from the *Hope at Easter* magazine, which you should have received together with this issue of the Village News.

Like the *Christmas Hope* magazine distributed last December, it comes to you as a gift from the local Ironstone churches, and we hope that you will enjoy having a look at it. If you happen to be into April Fools Day jokes - and get the magazine by the end of March - then there are also some pranks to try on page 26!

It strikes me that April Fools Day is a rather good day on which to celebrate Easter. Why? Because if it is true, then Easter turns our human expectations upside down, and shows how, in Jesus, God acts in a way that seems utterly foolish. If we find Easter hard to believe, then we are in good company, because the first friends and followers of Jesus also struggled to grasp what had happened.

The very last thing that they expected was to see Jesus alive again, just after He had been crucified. Yet on that first Easter as day began to dawn, some of the disciples came to the tomb of Jesus, only to find it empty and angels appearing to tell them that He had risen.

Then, in the hours and days that followed, more and more of them came to meet the Risen Lord for themselves. As they did so, the dawning light of their understanding

grew brighter. Now the disciples could see that Jesus really had triumphed over sin and death, once and for all. And in the light of this amazing new reality, everything in life could be viewed in a wonderful new light - the light of Easter hope.

Such hope can seem just as foolish now as it did then. Our world is still shrouded in a thick cloud of sorrow and despair, caused by sin and evil, suffering and death. Yet what happened on that first Easter has begun to change everything.

The power of God's love which raised Jesus to new life beyond death is now at work in our world, and countless lives have been changed by experiencing the presence and power of the Living Lord - power to bring hope out of despair, healing out of suffering, and life out of death.

For the death and resurrection of Jesus, you and I are invited to discover - as St Paul once wrote in a letter to the Church in Corinth - how "Christ (is) the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength". (1 Corinthians, chapter 1, verses 24 and 25).

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

What does Easter mean to you? Easter eggs? Fluffy chickens? Daffodils? These are some of the pictures that many of us would associate with Easter - symbols, in different ways, of new life and new beginnings. But Easter is also about contrasting images of death and resurrection. Daily in the news we are confronted with similar contrasting pictures of sorrow and joy.

None of us lives in a vacuum; we are all affected by the things that happen in this world. One important way our lives are touched is through our relationships; whether it be of the family, at work, in the church, or the village. Each of our lives is influenced by the relationships we have with other people. This is true, not only of our local communities, but in a similar way, of the community of nations that make up the world.

One of the messages of the Easter story is that where people are sad and distressed there can be reconciliation and healing. We worship a God who is ready to associate with human suffering, to endure what we have endured to the extent of allowing humankind to kill him on a Cross. But God has taken this symbol of disgrace and transformed it into a sign for reconciliation; a sign for peace between people and between people and God. The disciple Peter discovered the truth of this when Jesus "took him on again" after his resurrection, even though he had denied that he had ever known Jesus.

Reconciliation should be at the centre of the Christian Church's ministry. Coventry Cathedral has shown what can be done. This

work has developed since the cathedral was bombed during the Second World War and is symbolised in its Cross of Nails made from the ruins of the old cathedral. Today, a major part of the cathedral's ministry is to be a place of God's peace.

Every Friday at noon they say the Coventry Litany of Reconciliation. After the Second World War Coventry sought reconciliation with Dresden, a German city which was also very badly bombed and today they are working for peace in many of the world's trouble spots.

St Paul, writing to 1st century Christians wrote:

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation. (2 Corinthians 5, 17-18).

One of the world's most pressing needs is for peace; peace in the home, peace within local communities and peace between different countries. This can only begin to come about when people are prepared to let their old selves die and let the love of Christ become the dominant force in their lives.

The David Shepherd
Wildlife Foundation's
annual global canvas art award

This small primary school travelled to the Natural History Museum in London on 15th March, where they were delighted and surprised to be awarded second place in this worldwide competition. Over 4,500 children aged between 4 and 16 years from 15 countries, including the UK, Hong Kong, South America Russia, Malaysia and Singapore took part.

The theme of the competition was "Into the Wild" and the children decided to focus on plastic and its polluting and harmful effects on wildlife and the environment.

Their artwork was complemented by a poetry tree constructed from poems and Haikus written by the children about the importance of conservation and the impact of human activity on endangered species and their habitats.

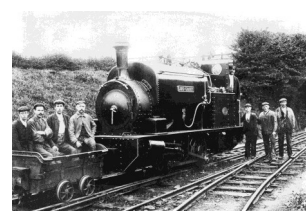
