

Letter from the Rector

Called to Pioneer

Dear Reader of the Village News,

I wonder what image the word 'pioneer' evokes for you? For me, it connects with the story of the American pioneers who moved away from their familiar surroundings to head West, and to begin a new way of life as settlers.

I remember how histories like Laura Ingalls Wilder's *Little House on the Prairie* painted such a vivid picture of what life was like for one particular pioneer family, as they left their home in Wisconsin forest and started out for the West in a covered wagon.

Pioneering is about breaking new ground, and about starting new ventures. It is about being willing to explore possibilities beyond the familiar, to think and act 'outside the box'. Pioneers remind us that, if we want to discover new things, then we need to move outside our 'comfort zone'.

This will involve trying things out, and learning as much from failure as success. And that can certainly be scary, as well as exciting!

I wonder if you have heard about Pioneer Ministry in the Church of England? Over the past few years, the Church of England

has encouraged those called to pioneer new ways of being church (sometimes known as 'fresh expressions'), and in the Diocese of Leicester Pioneer Ministry has been recognised as one to which some are called, and for which they are then licensed by the Bishop. If you're interested in finding out more, further details are available on the Diocese of Leicester website under the ministry section heading (https://www.leicester.anglican.org).

Within the Ironstone Villages Family of Churches, Mike and Christine Alexander are going to be licensed as Pioneer Ministers at a special service in Leicester Cathedral on Saturday, 13th October. Based in Waltham, the Alexanders will be looking to pioneer new ways of connecting the Christian faith with the wider community, and network with the growing number of pioneers across the Diocese.

Last month, Mike and Chris started a Café Church in Waltham which will now meet on the third Sunday morning of every month (9.30 to 11.00 am) - do consider giving it a try, and watch this space!

The year seems to be passing very quickly and it will soon be October! A year that seems to have been dominated in the United Kingdom by extremes of weather, cold and wet earlier in the year followed by a very hot dry summer and two storms in a week in September.

The 21st to 28th October is One World Week. Each year the One World Organisation produces some very thoughtful and challenging material about people's present lifestyle.

This year's theme is "The World is Changing How about us?". In the middle of September some climate scientists argued that the human race has just 25 years to change to stop climate change going out of control.

Seven years ago, the One World Movement considered the effect our present lifestyle has on the world and suggested five ways we could think through these issues.

Firstly, by valuing our planet and all life within it! Secondly, caring for the Earth now - before it is too late. Thirdly, learning about the effects of climate change and how to adapt to it. Fourthly, understanding that our actions in the UK impact upon the lives of people in some of the poorest parts of the world. Fifthly, what we choose to eat, buy and how we travel. This all affects people across the globe.

The Bible contains some very hard-hitting teaching which, while not specifically a "One World" theme, clearly has application to the way that we live now. The Old Testament prophets were very clear about justice issues. Micah says:

With what shall I come before the Lord? He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? (Micah 6: 6 and 8)

Iesus said many times that if we really love God we must love others too: people who live close to us and people who live in other parts of the world, particularly the world's poor.

One World Week is an annual event, but the issues that it raises are everyday ones. They are also faith issues. Each of us is challenged to look critically at our current lifestyle and reflect on how that impacts on other people. Jesus dares us all to live our lives, not just for ourselves, but for all who live in the world.






