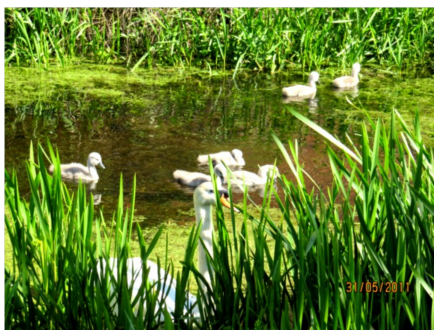

Letter from the Rector

They shall grow not old

Dear Reader of the Village News,

One hundred years ago, on 11th November 1918, the First World War finally came to an end. On Remembrance Sunday this month, in shared silence we shall remember all those who gave their lives in the service of King and country, and also those whose lives were changed forever by what happened one hundred years ago.

During the Great War, over nine million soldiers died as a result of the fighting, nearly six million civilians died from disease or starvation, and almost one million more were killed as a direct result of military operations.

In all, the estimate of dead resulting from the First World War stands at over 16 million. Then there were the wounded - more than 21 million. Some recovered, but others were never the same again, either in body or in mind.

It is hard for us to grasp just how deep an impact - emotional, physical, economic, political, psychological, and spiritual - the First World War has had on our nation. In rural communities such as ours, so many lives have been touched in one way or another by the legacy of war.

Events involving people like Private Henry Brown, whose memorial plaque is in Chadwell Church and who was remembered there in a special service held at the end of last month. Originally from Kent, he met Gertrude Durrands who was a Chadwell lass, love blossomed, and they were married in St Mary's. After the newly weds had lived for only a very short time in Chadwell, Henry Brown then left to serve with the Grenadier Guards in the First World War, and was the only soldier from Chadwell and Wycomb to be killed in action.

Tragically, the First World War was not 'the war to end war' (H G Wells). Rather, it would sow the seeds for the Second World War; and, as the daily news reminds us - the destructive cycle of widespread human conflict continues unabated in so many parts of the world.

Perhaps, if nothing else, the terrible reality of war gives lie to the myth of 'human progress'. It unmasks the terrible human capacity for evil, as well as our capacity for great good. It also highlights just how much we need God's help, if we are to overcome evil with good.

Thank God, then, that in Jesus Christ, such help is available for the asking. Christians believe that on the cross Jesus has unmasked evil and triumphed over sin and death, once and for all - and that, by His death and resurrection, the Living Lord has now opened for us the cross-shaped path to true and lasting peace - peace with God, with the world, and with one another.

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear All,

At eleven o'clock on 11th November it will be 100 years since the First World War ended. Time enough for us to pause and reflect where the world is now.

During the last few weeks I have been 'dipping' into the material produced by the Hope charity recalling the call to prayer that the Queen's grandfather, King George I initiated with parliament in August 2014 (www.remembrance100.co.uk/100-days).

For the final day, 11th November, the Archbishop of Canterbury sets out the six Rs of reconciliation for us to reflect on as we pray for peace and remember the many people, military and civilian, who have been killed as a result of past conflicts.

*The 6Rs are **researching, relating, relief, risk, reconciling and resourcing.** Let us look at what is behind each of these principles.*

*First, **researching:** this means looking at the problem which lies behind every conflict, understanding the issues and listening to every side.*

*Secondly, **relating:** reconciliation is not a machine-like process. It is about relationships between people and also between people and God. For there to be peace, relationships of trust and respect are needed.*

*Thirdly, **relief:** we can't say we care for one another and then do nothing to show it. We need to offer practical help to those in need, near and far away.*

*Fourthly, **risk:** there is a degree of risk in much of what we do. Sometimes we need to be prepared for things to go wrong in order that something better might emerge*

*Fifthly, **reconciliation:** genuine reconciliation requires a complete change of attitude - from hostility to acceptance and friendship, which is not easy. This is so important for Christians because God calls us to be peace-makers.*

*Lastly, **resourcing:** we are not left alone. Through his Holy Spirit, God gives us power and strength, enabling us to do things we thought beyond us.*

Today the human race faces many challenges linked with the future of the planet. The issue of climate change is fundamental, closely followed by issues connected with the way we share the earth's resources. To avoid conflict, it is necessary for all people to have a reasonable standard of life and for there to be justice and freedom for all. Where people are treated unfairly, there will be found the seeds of conflict.

My prayer for our times is for the human race to face up to and address these challenges so that our children and grandchildren's generations will not have to experience the conflicts that our parents and grandparents' generations did during the last 100 years.
