#### **Letter from the Rector**

Healing light in suffering darkness....

Dear Reader of the Village News,

Last month, I reflected on life's uncertainty at the beginning of the New Year. A few days after I wrote the article - just before Christmas - my wife Mary had a bad fall in the Vicarage garden, and fractured her upper right arm.

All the preparations Mary had made for leading Christmas services in the Melton Team had to be laid aside, and our plans for Christmas and the New Year had to be changed.

For someone as active as Mary, what happened has been both painful, confidence shaking, and deeply frustrating. Mary has had to rely on others to help her with even the most basic daily tasks, such as getting dressed and eating.

How quickly life can change! When unforeseen events suddenly overtake us, our best laid plans are often left in tatters. We are reminded that life is a precious and fragile gift, and of how easily we can take so much for granted.

It has certainly highlighted for me just how many domestic chores I have taken for granted, as I am now discovering how to operate washing machines and tumble driers!

Yet in the darkness of suffering, Mary and I have also received healing light from others. For example, we have come to appreciate more fully the care given by medical and

nursing staff. While it may not be perfect (none of us are!), our NHS is something for which we are most grateful.

Again, Mary has also valued the kind messages sent by well wishers, practical offers of help (Benji walking included!), and the assurance of prayers being offered for us. And we are most grateful to our family who have rallied around to provide us with essential support and encouragement.

In and through all of this, God is present. For in Jesus, we see how God comes to share the darkness of our suffering, so that we might come to share the light of His healing and wholeness.

As I quoted last month, in Jesus we are assured how God promises us

Strength for the day, Rest for the labour, Light for the way, Grace for trials, Help from above, Unfailing sympathy, Undying love.

## **SCALFORD CHURCH & St MARY'S CHADWELL Preparation of new Electoral Roll**

The Parochial Church Council are required to prepare a new electoral roll for the churches in Scalford Parish this year. Anybody already on the Roll needs to re-apply and anybody who is not on the Roll but would like to be is invited to ask for an application form.

The Electoral Roll is a church register of people eligible to vote at the annual parochial church meeting. To be eligible you need to have been baptised and to attend church, either at Scalford or Chadwell (either St Egelwin's, St Mary's or Scalford Methodist Church) or elsewhere. Forms are available in St Egelwin's Church, which is open between 10.00 am and 3.00 pm, or by contacting the PCC secretary on 01664 444673. A notice regarding data protection of electoral roll forms will be available to read in church.

All forms must be completed and either put in a box in church or delivered to 12 Church Street, Scalford, by 1st March.

## Letter from the Revd James Skinner

You may remember last July we had a meeting for any Christians living in the Scalford area about ways in which we could work together.

From that meeting the Anglican and Methodist congregations decided to collaborate regularly on the first two Sundays of every month in addition to special Sundays (such as Remembrance Sunday, Easter and Christmas), and at the regular Ironstone Benefice Services. On 16th January 2019 members of the two congregations met to review how these arrangements were going. I would like to update you with what we have put in place for 2019.

We decided the following: firstly, to continue the current pattern of working together on the first two Sundays of the month. Secondly, to have a joint service of readings and prayers for Good Friday on Good Friday evening, 7.00 pm at St Egelwin's church. On Easter Day there will be an Easter Communion Service at the Methodist Church at 10.30 am preceded by breakfast at 9.30 am. Another joint activity planned for the summer is a garden party outside the Methodist Chapel - details to follow later. We agreed to meet in early September to look at things again. I have enclosed a simple rota at the end of this article of where and when services happen each month.

On a completely different note, one of the repeating news headlines over recent months has been the increasing number of people using food banks in Great Britain. Difficulties with Universal Credit and the

economic situation in the country are contributing factors to the growing number of people in need. It may not be obvious to us, living in the countryside, but there are pockets of need even here.

My prayer for our country's leaders this year is that they might steer Parliament and the government in a direction that will enable provision of a suitable safety net for those who fall on hard times.

The Christian Good News taught that through Jesus' life and death everybody, regardless of background, could live together in God's family - and the early Christian leaders were aware of and sensitive to the needs of all the church's members.

I believe that the church family today, in Scalford and elsewhere can be the catalyst to bring about a bridging of some of the wider divisions that exist in our country today.




