Letter from the Rector

For the beauty of the earth ...

Dear Reader of the Village News,

I don't know about you, but spring is my favourite season of the year. I love to see the signs of new life appearing all around, the sight and scent of all the spring blossom, the fresh greening of nature - a reminder that I need to start cutting the vicarage lawns more regularly again! - and the new born lambs and calves in the fields. And just outside our kitchen window, Mary and I have particularly enjoyed watching a little family of robins making their home in a nesting box.

There is so much beauty in the world around us, beauty that we can easily miss in the midst of the pain and brokenness that is also present. In our anxious and fearful age, how important it is to celebrate the goodness we experience, and to appreciate the beauty.

As we lift our eyes above the mess and mayhem of which the daily news reminds us, we can catch a glimpse of the wonder of life - life which speaks of the One who is our Creator.

Perhaps you have come across the writings of Mother Julian? She was a recluse who lived in Norwich in the 14th century, someone who on 8th May 1373 received from God a series of visions of Jesus.

Like ours, hers was also an anxious and fearful age; for example, the Hundred Years War was being waged abroad, and there was huge devastation caused by the Black Death. Hers too was an age of social distress and disturbance, an age when the Church was in some disarray.

Julian was a realist about the human condition. She knew from personal experience about the pain of life and the problem of evil. Yet she also knew the deep peace and assurance that comes from receiving and trusting the love God has for us in Jesus Christ.

In her book *Revelations of Divine Love* probably the first book written by a woman in English - Julian recorded her visions. In one of them she describes how God showed her "a little thing, the size of a hazelnut, on the palm of my hand, round like a ball. I looked at it thoughtfully and wondered, 'What is this?' And the answer came: 'It is all that is made'. In this 'little thing' I saw three truths. The first is that God made it; the second is that God loves it; and the third is that God sustains it".

Yes, this amazing world is made by God; it is loved by God; and it is sustained by God. May each of us know this truth ever more fully; and may we show our gratitude and appreciation by the way in which we take care of this wonderful planet earth.

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends.

Many of you will know I will be on sabbatical leave from May to July this year. Sabbaticals were introduced by the Methodist Church to enable ministers every seven years to have a time away from circuit duties, to allow for physical, mental and spiritual refreshment.

This is my fourth sabbatical, during which I hope to explore one of my life-long interests, the German composer J S Bach. He wrote a lot of music for the Lutheran Church, and was music director for two churches in Leipzig for over 256 years.

I shall explore in particular how he writes about death, which was a very regular event in the eighteenth century. Some of Bach's most profound music was written on this subject - for funerals and also on the way Christians looked on death.

To help me in this I will be going to Germany, to visit some of the places Bch lived and worked in. Interestingly, one of the places Bach lived is just a few miles away from where Martin Luther, the great Protestant reformer, had lived a hundred and fifty years earlier in the 1520s.

I have also planned a short retreat at Launde Abbey with the title "Seeing the Light" involving another of my hobbies, photography. Kath and I also hope to catch up with our family as well as doing some sorting out for when we move to Oxfordshire when I retire in two years' time.

Some of you may have heard in the last few weeks that Scalford Methodist Church has

decided to close later this year. For the last nine months the church members have been discussing the best way forward. One of the major issues was the large amount of money needed to repair the building and to keep it running on a sustainable basis.

This decision has still to be confirmed at various church meetings; however, the plan is that the final service will be on 13th October at 4.00 pm and the building will not be available to use by other groups after 31st October.

There will be more details about this nearer the time. It is sad when a Church fellowship decides to close but God's people are a travelling people and there are times when the nature of the Christian witness has to change and God's people need to look for other ways and means to continue their witness. My prayer for the future is that the Methodist presence in the village can continue in some other way.

I shall be away from this column until September; Deacon Alison will be writing to you in June.


