pray through the pain of a serious shoulder fracture, something that helped me greatly was a book by Pete Greig: "How to Pray: A simple guide for normal people".

Pete Greig is the founder of the now international and interdenominational 24-7 Prayer movement., and he has recently launched the Prayer Course, which I'll be running this Autumn.

It's an eight-week journey designed to help anyone - from absolute 'beginners' to lifelong pray-ers - grow closer to God in prayer.

Each session takes its starting point from the Lord's Prayer, and goes on to explore the riches of different aspects of Christian prayer: whether that's enjoying God's presence in praise and worship; asking God for things in prayer and wrestling with the problem of apparently unanswered prayer; spending time with God in silence, tuning in to hear God's voice rather than doing all the talking ourselves; and how we can pray God's kingdom come in the midst of a spiritual battle.

Nicky Gumbel (pioneer of Alpha and Vicar of arlier this year, when I was struggling to HTB in London) writes in the foreword to 'How to Pray': "Prayer brings us peace, refreshes our soul, satisfies our spiritual hunger and assures us of our forgiveness. Prayer not only changes us, it also changes situations".

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

The months September and October are a time of the year in which we are challenged to think about the relationship of the human race with the rest of the planet. The end of September/beginning of October is the time when church Harvest Festivals frequently happen - when we thank God for the abundance of creation in again providing food.

For some years, the third week of October has been marked as One World Week. Backed both by people of faith and of no faith, this week challenges us to work with others in caring for the earth and its resources.

During the last few weeks United Nations scientists have reported that we need to change the way we live, eating less meat and dairy and have a more plant and seed-based diet.

We also need to take other measures to reduce the amount of carbon being put into the atmosphere. Ways we could do this include planting more trees and changing the way we farm the land. This is necessary to ensure life will be possible for generations to come.

The effects of climate change are already being seen in many places around the world this year, not least in the United Kingdom, with flooding recently in Wainfleet, Lincolnshire, in Yorkshire in the North of England and causing the dam emergency at Whaley Bridge.

The Bible, particularly in the Psalms, speaks about the wonders of God in the universe (psalms 8, 104). It also reflects on the role people have in creation. Two views are put forward.

The first is that people are the height of God's creation, tasked with subduing and having dominion over it (Genesis 1:28ff). The second view recognises that people are part of God's creation; they are to live responsibly, becoming a blessing to the rest of creation in the same way that creation is a blessing to them.

Since the industrial revolution at the start of the nineteenth century, the human race, by the way it has lived, has had a profound effect on all creation. Now the human race is affecting the fragile balance which allows life to continue.

As we celebrate the fruitfulness of the earth again, let us also take action on the issues the One World Movement continues to highlight and many scientists warn us about - by adjusting our own lifestyles and challenging our political leaders to take the decisions which will enable our planet to be a place where all can share in its bounty.

calford, with Chadwell and Wycomb, church works very closely with the other churches in the benefice (Goadby Marwood, Eastwell, Eaton. Waltham on the Wolds and Stonesby) with our shared vicar and other resources. An office in Scalford church is being developed for administration work.

The benefice has also explored working with the Asfordby benefice and the West Vale of Belvoir benefice to share not only this space but also administrator's hours, and this will go ahead as soon as a person is appointed first in a temporary office and then in the church once the necessary work has been completed.

Further, we have together looked at other needs, and with the closure of the chapel an obvious need arises for a meeting space within the village. The church here needs to be sustainable and used to greater capacity. The opening daily for the office work is a good start, but we have also explored using the space at the back of the building,

between vestry and servery, for a meeting

The area would be developed as a room with independent heating and lighting, but with the facility to open up the entire front wall to allow the space to still be used as part of the whole. This would be beneficial to the church, and our neighbouring churches, but also the thriving primary school which is very much part of this exciting idea, and often needs extra space.

With the chapel going, we can also offer other community activities a new 'home' and would welcome old and new groups, committees, and others to come and use this much loved historical building.




