# Letter from the Rector

# Brexit - Pray for our nation and its leaders

Dear Friends,

I'm writing this in early September, just a few days after Parliament has returned following the summer recess. In those momentous few days, once again we have seen how deeply divided Parliament is over Brexit - over how to bring it about, or whether it should happen at all.

While it is almost impossible to predict what will happen next, it does seem increasingly likely that there will be a General Election before too long. One way or another, our divided politicians are now going to ask our divided nation for some clarity as to how we proceed from the present Brexit impasse.

I don't know about you, but I'm tempted to despair over what is going on, and the way in which truth has become a casualty of this national crisis. Our nation is at a critical turning point in its history. The decisions we now make, and the way that we make them, will have far reaching and long term consequences.

What, then, can you and I do? We can certainly vote when the time comes. We can also watch our language in the way we debate the issues with others, looking to focus on the problems, and not rubbish other people who hold a different viewpoint.

Above all, I believe that we really do need to pray for our nation and its leaders. As at

other times of national crisis, we need to seek wisdom from God above, and remember that prayer can make a difference, even in the most unpromising of situations.

As St Paul puts it:

"The first thing I want you to do is pray. Pray every way you know how, for everyone you know. Pray especially for rulers and their governments to rule well so we can be quietly about our business of living simply, in humble contemplation. This is the way our Saviour God wants us to live".

(1 Timothy 2: 1,2 The Message).

Here is a prayer for our nation and our leaders:

God of hope,
in these times of change,
unite our nation
and guide our leaders with your wisdom.
Give us courage to overcome our fears,
and help us to build a future
in which all may prosper and share;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

# Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends.

Many of you will be aware that Scalford Methodist Church will be closing next month. The final service is on 13th October at 4.00 pm, to which you are all warmly invited. The service is also a Circuit Service so there will be members from all the Melton Mowbray Circuit churches as well as the members of Scalford church.

It will be an opportunity to give thanks for the years of Methodist witness which go back to the middle of the 19th century. While Scalford Methodist Church will be closing, Methodist worship still continues in the Ironstone Benefice at Stonesby Methodist Church where worship is held each week at 10.45 am; a warm welcome is extended to all who would like to come.

How many of us still grow some of the food we eat? Growing your own has been on the rise in recent years; after years of decline, allotments are in demand again. This year has been a reasonable year for growers. After a cool, wet June we have had warm sun and enough rain to ensure our crops have flourished. I am always very grateful for our productive vegetable plot!

Today the connection between people, the food we eat and the ground in which it is grown is more tenuous than ever and many children are unaware of where their food comes from. The Bible is very clear about the link. The creation stories in Genesis (chapter 2) tell of the close relationship between people and the ground.

In Hebrew the word for ground is 'admah' and the name given to the first person is Adam. In Roman culture the same link is there: 'human' and 'humus', the ground. We are, it seems, being daily reminded about climate change as it impacts more dramatically, emphasising again how close the link is and illustrating how the way we live profoundly affects the ground - the world we live in.

As a country we now only grow about a third of all the food we eat. As we sing the harvest hymn 'We plough the fields and scatter the good seed on the land', we should be conscious of how much we depend on others for our food, much of which comes from other parts of the world.

We might also reflect how easy it is for us to pay the price we wish for our food, rather than considering the cost to the person who grows it for us. The Bible has much to say to God's people about business being conducted in a fair and proper way and the prophets were very critical of rulers when people were exploited. (Amos 5).

On Sunday (29th September 2019) I will be sharing with the Revd John Barr in leading the Ironstone Harvest Festival at Scalford Parish Church, when we can thank God for a productive summer here and for all our food wherever it comes from.

# SCALFORD CHURCH WITHIN THE BENEFICE OF THE IRONSTONE CHURCHES SCALFORD PCC

http://villagenews.e-kit.co.uk

S calford, with Chadwell and Wycomb, church works very closely with the other churches in the benefice (Goadby Marwood, Eastwell, Eaton, Waltham on the Wolds and Stonesby) with our shared vicar and other resources. An office in Scalford church is being developed for administration work.

The benefice has also explored working with the Asfordby benefice and the West Vale of Belvoir benefice to share not only this space but also administrator's hours, and this will go ahead as soon as a person is appointed - first in a temporary office and then in the church once the necessary work has been completed.

Further, we have together looked at other needs, and with the closure of the chapel an obvious need arises for a meeting space within the village. The church here needs to be sustainable and used to greater capacity. The opening daily for the office work is a good start, but we have also explored using the space at the back of the building,

between vestry and servery, for a meeting room.

The area would be developed as a room with independent heating and lighting, but with the facility to open up the entire front wall to allow the space to still be used as part of the whole. This would be beneficial to the church, and our neighbouring churches, but also the thriving primary school which is very much part of this exciting idea, and often needs extra space.

With the chapel going, we can also offer other community activities a new 'home' and would welcome old and new groups, committees, and others to come and use this much loved historical building.

Your comments are invited and your interest in using such a space is welcomed. If you would like to know more, pleases come and meet us on Sunday, 20th October, between 3.00 and 4.00 pm in church.


