GREENING FRAMLAND - HEATING OUR CHURCHES

Heating churches for services is a big problem for church councils. It is estimated that to heat the average village church in the winter for a Sunday service takes over 100 KW of heat. The churches were built in the day before insulation, double glazing and other heat saving aspects of buildings. Many have thin timber/lead roofs, leaded windows and doors that are not draft proofed, which leads to extensive heat loss. In addition, most are heritage buildings and as such are listed, making any change to improve the heat conservation difficult.

With the current issues of a global climate emergency facing us, churches have to consider how they expend such large quantities of energy, and to date very little has been done to improve the situation. This was concerning many in the Framland Deanery - particularly those churches which were considering renovations to the buildings or changes to the heating systems.

The Deanery therefore applied to the *Rural Community Energy Fund a joint scheme by DEFRA and the Department of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy*) for a grant to study our churches and propose ways in which they can remain in public use but become more sustainable. We were successful in this

Letter from the Rector

Great Expectations ...?

Dear Friends,

What do you and I really look forward to? Maybe it is Christmas with all its trimmings? During this month the level of excitement and anticipation certainly rises in many households, as children eagerly anticipate their Christmas presents, and there is all the extra activity involving (and stress!) in preparing for Christmas. Christmas promises such a lot, doesn't it? A powerful cocktail of nostaligia and advertisements can conjure up a captivating scene where loved ones gather, fires glow brightly, and the only sounds are of laughter and merriment.

Yet we know that this festive season rarely delivers on what it promises. bid and have a grant of £40,000 to appoint a group of expert energy engineers and heritage architects to

look at several of our churches. The idea is that they look in detail at four churches and produce a model of sustainability (a mix of methods of heat production and conservation). This model will then be tested in three other churches to ensure they have taken account of all foreseeable aspects. The model can then be used across the country.

The four churches are Ab Kettleby, Nether Broughton, Old Dalby and Waltham on the Wolds and the three test churches are Stathern, Holwell and Thorpe Arnold.

When this study is completed (July next year) we will have a template to follow to improve and make our churches more welcoming. We should also be able to apply for further funding to develop the model in greater detail.

Are you ready for Christmas? As I write Christmas Day is still over a month away, yet various Christmas activities are already being advertised for the first part of December.

Before Christmas, in the church calendar, comes the season of Advent; a time of getting ready, of preparing ourselves to celebrate Jesus' birth. This year the Advent season starts on 1st December, lasting through to 24th December. It is one church season which can easily be forgotten as we are so eager to get to Christmas.

These days it seems waiting is rarely encouraged. Sometimes we find it hard to wait, because we are used to getting what we want straight away. A well-known credit card company used to run an advertisement claiming its card took the waiting out of wanting. Sometimes we are not sure what we are waiting for.

The word Advent means 'coming' and in the Church year the Advent season is both a time of waiting and looking forward to Jesus' 'coming'.

This waiting and looking forward is found in three basic ways or time periods in the Bible.

Firstly, time past, where Bible passages - usually found in the prophetic books - look forward to the coming of God's special time with his chosen leader, or Messiah. Secondly, the time present, where Christians celebrate Jesus, God's Messiah, as the coming to pass of the prophets' hopes. Thirdly, there is time future, where Christians look forward to Christ's coming again at the end of time.

There is a famous much quoted verse in the book of Ecclesiastes:

"There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under heaven". (3: 1 GNB)

So - this Advent, let us not be in too much of a hurry to get to Christmas, but take time to try and find a deeper meaning in the planning, preparation and waiting period which precedes it.
