Letter from the Rector

More than Gold ...

Dear Friends,

How will England, Scotland or Wales fare, in Euro 2020? Shame that my homeland of Northern Ireland couldn't make it a full set for the United Kingdom!

Then, later this month our sporting attention switches to athletics, as the Olympic Games (23rd July—8th August) and Paralympic Games (24th August—5th September) begin.

The motto of this year's Tokyo Olympic Games is *"Inspire a Generation"*. If - like me - you enjoy sport (as a player or spectator), then you will know how sport can indeed inspire great commitment and loyalty.

In the face of all the challenges presented by the current pandemic, the wholehearted dedication of athletes to achieve sporting success is especially inspiring. Preparation for the Olympics requires a strict regime of training and self-discipline, if the athlete's skills are to be finely honed, and their potential for sporting achievement fully realised.

In the same way, if we are to follow Jesus wholeheartedly, then this too will require a commitment to training and self-discipline.

Being a disciple is not a spectator sport. Rather - like an athlete, or sports person in soccer or any sport - it means an ongoing commitment to careful preparation, and active participation.

In the New Testament, sport is mentioned several times as a metaphor for the life of faith - do see how many references you can find!

In one of them, St Paul reminds us that we need to keep the goal in mind, which is more than gold: "You've all been to the stadium and seen the athletes race. Everyone runs; one wins. Run to win. All good athletes train hard. They do it for a gold medal that tarnishes and fades. You're after one that's gold eternally". (1 Corinthians 9.24-27 *The Message*)

Wishing you every blessing in Jesus Christ, who enables us to achieve more than gold,

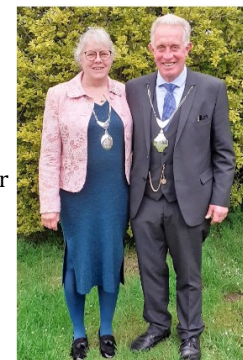
