Letter from the Rector

Thirsty ground, and wellspring of life

Dear friends,

Over the past few months, there has been very little rain in our area. While other parts of the UK - Scotland and Northern Ireland included - have had more rainfall, Central and Southern England has seen much less than usual. Water rationing has been introduced in some areas (e.g. hosepipe bans).

The first half of this year has been the driest in England since 1976, and this prolonged spell of dry weather has affected the timing and quality of the harvest gathered by farmers. The impact has also been evident in our gardens - eg. Sun-baked ground, and dry brittle grass.

Perhaps by the time you read this, the situation will have changed; but even so it will certainly take a considerable amount of rain to replenish the depleted reservoirs, and to soften the hard, dry ground.

While we may grumble at having to be more careful in our use of water, other parts of the world are faring so much worse. For example, many parts of Africa (eg. The Horn of Africa) are experiencing the worst drought for many years. This has led to famine - food shortages made even worse by the war in Ukraine which are now affecting global food supplies. Such prolonged hot dry conditions are believed to be closely connected with the impact of climate change.

Our land is thirsty. Yet I wonder when any of our churches last prayed for rain? In the Book of Common Prayer, there is the following prayer for rain:

O God, heavenly Father, who by thy Son Jesus Christ hast promised to all them that seek thy Kingdom, and the righteousness thereof, all things necessary to their bodily sustenance: Send us, we beseech thee, in this our necessity, such moderate rain and showers, that we may receive the fruits of the earth to our comfort, and to thy honour; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

In the dry and thirsty lands of the Bible, rain is seen as a God-given blessing. And it is also a picture of the spiritual blessing that God longs to give when people turn away from their foolish ways, and seek to return to the Lord.

Christians believe that as we turn to Jesus Christ, we find in Him all we shall ever need to soften our hard hearts and quench our spiritual thirst. Jesus says this to all who hear His voice and come to Him in faith: "Whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life"!. (John 4.14).


