dition. It will undoubtedly be in the best condition since soon after manufacture in 1904.







## Hope in the face of death

#### Dear friends,

Oh, the best laid plans! Last month, I had prepared my article for this month before going on holiday. Then, on the afternoon of Thursday, 8th September, while my wife |Mary and I were enjoying the lovely sea view in Woolacombe (North Devon), the sad news broke about the Queen's death.

Although it was to be expected, the reality of what had happened still came as an unsettling shock, and the world seemed to have changed. Someone who had been there as a symbol of stability in a rapidly changing world had gone, and in the space of only two days we now had a new Prime Minister and then a new King.

Jut a few months ago, we were celebrating the Platinum Jubilee. Now, following her death, we continue to give thanks for the example of loving and faithful service and dedication to duty shown by her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. And we pray too for his Majesty King Charles III, the Queen Consort, and all the members of the Royal Family in these early days of their bereavement.

While death will come to us all, our society often struggles to face this ultimate reality. Death abruptly reminds us of just how fleeting our lives really are, even a long and full life like that of the late Queen.

Just before the Committal at a graveside, some words are often said from Psalm 103 which express this truth poignantly: "!Our days are like the grass; we flourish like a flower of the field; when the wind goes over it, it is gone and its place will know it no more".


Yet there is hope., For Christians, this hope is rooted and grounded in what God has done through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. By bursting through the barrier of death, Christ has opened the way to life beyond death.

In Christ, we are assured that death does not have the final say on life, and that God's love cannot be destroyed even by death. One of the Bible passages that speaks of this is 1 Corinthians, chapter 15. It is a passage very well worth reading and reflecting on, as it expresses the Christian hope of resurrection in the light of Christ's own resurrection.

In the face of death, may the light of the hope we are given in Jesus Christ bring us comfort and peace, and to all who find themselves in "the valley of the shadow of death" (Psalm 23).

## Letter from the Rector (2)

#### No place like home ...?

What does home mean to you? Like all vicarages or rectories, my home goes with the job, and much of the time it is also a 'work-place'. Although I don't own the house (or any property), 23 Melton Road, Waltham on the Wolds is my home, and I'm grateful to have somewhere that I can call "home".

However, many people have no place they can call home. Surveys have shown that on any given night, tens of thousands of families and individuals are experiencing homelessness across Great Britain; this includes over 200,000 households in England alone.

For the last five years 'core homelessness' (ie. Rough sleeping, people living in sheds, garages and other unconventional buildings, sofa surfing, hostels and unsuitable temporary accommodation such as B&Bs) has increased steadily in England.

People become homeless for lots of different reasons. There are social causes of homelessness, such as a lack of affordable housing, poverty and unemployment, and life events (like a relationship breakdown) which push people into homelessness.

People with no home to go to are forced into homelessness when they leave prison, care or the army. A high proportion of women experiencing homelessness have escaped a violent or abusive relationship. Many people become homeless simply because they can no longer afford the rent.

Being homeless often causes mental or physical health problems to worsen or become harder to resolve. And yet, in nearly all cases homelessness is preventable and in every case, it could be ended.

In October - especially from 9th to 16th - the Church Homeless Trust is asking us all to reflect on the plight of those affected by homelessness and poverty. Church Homeless Trust (https://churchhomelesstrust.org.uk) has a background of more than 130 years supporting homeless people.

They say: "We believe that home is not just a roof over your head; a home is a place where we belong. It provides the safety and opportunity to establish roots, and develop into the person we were created to be. It is somewhere we are cared for, and somewhere we care about".

I close with a prayer that has been written for World Homeless Week:

Almighty God of refuge and strength, in whose image we are all made, and who is a home to any who are in need or trouble; inspire Your Church with the spirit of Christ's love, empower us to work for change, direct our actions towards any who need food, comfort, shelter and sanctuary and help us to live as one with one another, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.



## SURVIVOR SURVEY

The National Safeguarding Team (NST) in the Church of England launched a national anonymous survey on 19th July to listen to all victims and survivors of abuse and how they would like to be involved in the development and implementation of a Church of England survivor engagement framework. The survey was initially planned to run until 18th September

With the great loss of her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, the deadline for the survey has been extended to **Sunday**, **9th October**, to enable people to express their pain and pay their tributes. The survey will continue to provide a confidential and open space for many victims and survivors of abuse to share their views on how to have a say and participate in developing and implementing a survivor engagement framework in the Church.

The survey is open to any person who identifies themselves as being abused or neglected or being at risk of any type of abuse (including, but not limited to, domestic, emotional, financial, spiritual or organisational abuse, exploitation, self-harm, neglect/acts of omission, etc).
