"HOW TO MAKE A PATCHWORK CHRISTMAS TREE"

Christmas - All the small things ...?

Dear friends,

Many Christmas adverts conjure up sentimentality, nostalgia and joy. However, this year, as the cost of living soars, some retailers have opted for a more muted approach to their campaigns.

For example, have you seen the John Lewis advert called The Beginner? It shows a middle-aged man learning how to skateboard, and suffering a series of accidents and failed attempts in the process.

In the final scene, we meet Ellie, a young teenager clutching her skateboard as she waits to enter her new foster home.

The reason for the man's efforts become clear - he was trying to master the skill of skateboarding, in order to connect with Ellie.

The advert is less about buying things, and more about kindness. As Claire Pointon from John Lewis puts it, the "advert is not about 'go and buy things'. This advert is about saying how can you as an individual show kindness to someone else who may need it. I think that's quite an important message at Christmas."

Yes, showing kindness to others is an important message at Christmas - as it is all year round. How we care for each other matters more than all the 'stuff' that we usually share at Christmas. As the song to which the John Lewis advert is set *All the small things* by the artist Mike Geier puts it: "All the small things True care, truth brings"

At the heart of Christmas, God shows us His kindness and true care in the birth of Jesus Christ. In this tiny baby, born in an obscure part of the world in humble surroundings, God lays bare His "true care", and "truth brings" to our confused and conflicted world.

The birth of Jesus Christ lit a small light in the darkness, the light of God-given hope, a light which still shines in the darkness of our world. This light can be kindled in each of us, and shared with one another, making our world a brighter place.

As her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II said in her 1976 Christmas address: "Remember that good spreads outwards and every little does help. Mighty things from small beginnings grow as indeed they grew from the small child of Bethlehem".

Despite the chilly weather, there is still plenty of wildlife to see during the winter months. So wrap up warm and get outdoors!

Birds of prey

Winter can be a great time of year to look for birds of prey. Short-eared owls can be seen more widely in the winter, as migrants join resident birds. They mainly hunt during the daytime, flying low over moorland and grasslands.

Winter can also be a great time of year to look for barn owls, as they often extend their hunting hours into daylight to find the extra food they need to get them through the colder months.

Winter waders

The winter may feel chilly to us, but for waders nesting in the Arctic, the UK is a paradise! Every autumn, wading birds head for our food-rich wetlands in astounding numbers. At Rutland Water Nature Reserve, tens of thousands of wildfowl arrive every winter, with as many as 25,000 ducks, geese and swans being recorded. They are joined by wintering grebes, divers and egrets, coming together to create one incredible wild winter spectacle.




