There might be one more plot available to rent if anyone is interested.



Lovely as they are, it is impractical to add an extra page for each event (as a pdf reduced usually makes the text illegible - and a pdf re-typed, apart from taking guite a chunk of time to do, never turns out guite as well).

Having said that, I'm always happy to add any individual notices as an appendix to the email distribution (but not hard copies) for people to open if they wish - and the event can still appear within the Village News itself as a guarter or half page display, with a reference to the appendix for more information.

Letter from the Rector

Pilgrim's Progress

Dear friends,

How do you view life? Some view life as a futile existence. William Shakespeare puts this gloomy view in the mouth of Macbeth, following the death of his wife:

"Life's but a walking shadow, a poor player, That struts and frets his hour upon the stage, And then is heard no more. It is a tale Told by an idiot, full of sound and fury, Signifying nothing."

By contrast, those who follow Jesus Christ are encouraged to view life as a journey with a God-given destination - or, in other words, as a pilgrimage. Think, for example, of John Bunyan's classic work Pilgrim's Progress and Bunvan's hvmn Who would true valour see.

Last month, I mentioned how Bishop Martyn is travelling around the Diocese on a pilgrimage during this season of Lent. On Sunday, 5th March, he will be joining us for the 10.30 am service in Scalford, as well as calling into other Ironstone churches on his pilgrimage around this part of Leicestershire.

During this month, we shall also be thinking about what it means to follow lesus as His pilgrim people, in a Lent series taking place on Wednesday evenings. Each evening, a different speaker (including some familiar names below!) will share why they have chosen to follow Jesus, and why they would encourage others to do so.

These Lent sessions start at 7.30 pm and a short service of Compline (Night Prayer) will conclude each evening.





Last Friday (10th February) saw a great turnout at Waltham church where 50 people attended a history talk by Jed Jaggard (Up An' at 'Em History). He ran an evening entitled "READY? STEADY? (RATION!) COOK!". He shared many interesting facts about rationing during and after the wars, how and what people had and made it interactive with audience participation in having a go at making some of the recipes that would have been around in those times. It was brilliant to see so many people attend, and stay for tea and cake afterwards, kindly supplied by Julie and Neil - Jed's parents.

I am so grateful for everyone's support, in particular to Jed who gave up his evening to do this for me. We managed to raise £276: these funds are going towards my trip to South Korea which takes place from late July –August for three weeks. I am an Explorer Scout from the 1st Waltham Scout Group who has been selected to attend the World Scout Jamboree. Only two of us made it from the Melton District and we are in a troop of 32 Scouts representing Leicestershire.

It is an amazxing opportunity offered to Scouts and Explorers (14-18 year olds) to be able to attend a World Scout Jamboree, involving over 40,000 scouts from around the world! This Jamboree happens every four years and this will be the 25th! The theme for the Jamboree is 'Draw your Dream', which is why all the participants, like myself, have been able to have a say in the kind of activities we want to take part in. Each of us has to fundraise for the trip, a total of £4,100, part of which will go towards less fortunate scouts from around the world. Whilst in South Korea we will be able to experience the culture, attempt new challenges, spend time in Seoul and along with the rest of the UK contingent we are being given the opportunity to visit the Demilitarised Zone between North and South Korea. It will be a trip of a lifetime and I am very grateful to all who have supported me so far.

The brown hare is part of our folklore, its energetic leaping and wild chasing has given rise to sayings such as 'mad as a March hare' and 'hare-brained', and we all know the character of the March Hare in Lewis Carroll's Alice in Wonderland.

However, they are actually a non-native species; it is thought that they were first introduced to England during Roman times or by people of the Iron Age.

Did you know?

- A male brown hare is called a 'lack' and a female is called a 'Jill'
- Witches were once thought to have the power to turn into hares to escape their enemies
- In folklore the hare is associated with fertility and the original Easter bunny was actually a hare.

Brown hare numbers have seen a decline in the last 60 years: you can help protect them and other local wildlife by joining your local Wildlife Trust. Leicestershire and Rutland Wildlife Trust is the leading conservation charity in Leicestershire and Rutland working to protect and enhance local wildlife and wild places and engage people with nature.
