Your Community and Church needs YOU

Dear friends.

During this month, we shall share in celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla - the first coronation that many of us will have seen. Over the extended Bank Holiday weekend of 6th to 8th May, Albert Schweitzer once remarked: "the only as well as the Coronation Service on the morning of Saturday, 6th (which is being livestreamed in Waltham Church), there will serve". be various community celebrations taking place around our villages.

One of the themes of the Coronation Weekend is that of service in the community. volunteering, encouraging people to join the work being undertaken to support their local areas. 





It's time for some action! The first two insect hotel workshops are planned for Saturday, 13th May. There is a morning session in the Youth Wing of the Waltham Village Hall from 10.00 to 12.00 hrs and an afternoon session in the church in Thorpe Arnold from 14.00 to 16.00 hrs. The hands-on workshops are for young and old, individual people and families. It will be given by David Abley from Melton Green Transition.



The workshops are organised by the Waltham on the Wolds and Thorpe Arnold Biodiversity Group.

Please bring some of these materials: ceramic pots, tin cans, biscuit cans, wooden boxes, dead twigs and branches, leaves, moss, bark, small pieces of wood, and broken ceramic pieces. Lots of these things you will find when clearing your garden in the following days or weeks. Also, for your safety, bring garden gloves to handle material with sharp edges.

Keep a watch out for swifts!

The Waltham on the Wolds and Thorpe Arnold Biodiversity Group has started a project to study and encourage breeding swifts in both villages. Swifts are remarkable birds that spend most of their lives on the wing.

As a starting point, we hope to establish where swifts were breeding last year and are likely to return in May. Let us know if you spot them, usually making a shrieking sound high in the sky, or if you know where they are nesting, usually in a hole under the eaves of buildings, particularly older buildings, as modern buildings are sealed up.

Swifts can often be confused with swallows and house martins. Look at the RSPOB illustration to see the difference. Please contact Martin with all your observations:


