Horse chestnut tree: shorten back limbs overhanging roof of garage and driveway by up to two metres to suitable growth points, to reduce leaf litter and shading.

At the Annual Meeting in May 2022, it was agreed to increase the cost of the tenancy fees to £30.00 effective from October 23, as advised on last year's renewal notices. The increase was based on expected increased cost, particularly for the supply of water; however, these increases have not been as high as first indicated. At this year's Annual Meeting in May 2023 the proposed increase was reviewed and it was agreed to reduce the increase at October 2023 down by £5.00. Therefore the renewal fee this October will be £25 and not £30, as previously stated.

Letter from the Rector

Minster Communities - where are we now ...?

Dear friends,

VILLAGE NEWS

Earlier this year the parishes of our Framland Deanery, together with some from part of a neighbouring deanery, entered into a series of meetings to help us to navigate our way through the formation of Minster Communities in this part of the Diocese.

Each church was invited to prepare a 'Storyboard' to share with others something of how we see ourselves. Then individual churches (mainly through PCCs) and Fresh Expressions were invited to fill in a 'Conversation Prompts Workbook' to assist us in providing snapshots of the current realities of our life together. These snapshots cover the nine aspects of Discipleship and Mission, Growing Faith and Schools, Pioneering/New Community, Finance and Generosity, Church Buildings, People and Ministry, Geography, Engagement (with the process of change) and Safeguarding.

By the end of June, the Conversations Prompts results were submitted and these will contribute to discussions about possible Minster Community Groupings. Some options for potential groupings will be sent to all PCCs in the coming weeks who will be invited to respond with any comments and preferences. Through it all, the aim behind Minster Communities is to establish a sustainable and mission-focused future foundation for the worshipping communities across our Diocese.

Bishop Martyn has reminded us that we are sharing together in this process: diocese'. I know, can feel like a distant, abstract entity to those embedded in parish life, and I know there are fears that Minster Communities are being devised and managed from the centre. But the diocese is all of us every worshipping community, whatever its size, location or theological tradition - and every role at St Martins House and Bishop's Lodge exists to support you all in your ministry. So, when it comes to forming Minster Communities, the part played by the Parish Transition and Ministry Development Team is to listen, facilitate and support, not to impose. They will help you prayerfully discern what this model will look like in your context so that we all, as part of the Body of Christ in Leicester and Leicestershire, can help to realise the Kingdom of God in the years to come. It is a process in which we support you in identifying and articulating personal and collective strengths, callings and opportunities, and one in which every worshipping community has an equal voice."
