Lastly, at the December meeting it was agreed that (Cllr) Simon Tong would be the council's representative in discussions with neighbouring parishes about arrangements for forthcoming 2024 festivals such as Forbidden Forest.



Letter from the Rector

Looking back and looking forward

Dear friends,

How do you approach the start of another year? Do you find yourself looking back maybe with both regret for what is now 'in the past', but also with gratitude for what was good, or with relief at leaving a difficult time behind you? And how do you feel about what lies ahead - maybe a mixture of optimism tinged with anxiety?

How we feel about the future is, of course, influenced by what's going on in the world around us. 2023 was such a tumultuous year - full of uncertainty, war, and environmental disaster. So we ask ourselves, will the New Year bring more of the same, or do we dare to hope for real improvements?

Human beings have always wrestled with the mixed emotions that accompany our looking back and looking forward, and people have often turned to their religious belief to give them inspiration at the turn of the year.

The very word 'January' comes from the name of the ancient Roman god Janus. Represented by a double-faced head, Janus was the deity presiding over doors and gateways, the god of beginnings, transitions and endings. He has two faces because one looks to the future and one to the past.

The Bible gives us ample assurance that we can trust the past to the God who created and loves this world and who holds our future in His hands. The prophet Jeremiah records this divine promise: "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope" (Jeremiah 29.11).

When Christians celebrate Holy Communion, we're reminded that the past, the present and the future are encompassed by what God has done for us in His Son Jesus, when we say the words: "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again!".

It was his faith in Jesus Christ that inspired St Paul to write to the church in Rome: "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us...." (Romans 8.18).

Mixed feelings about the past and the future are part of our human nature. We can offer them to our Heavenly Father in prayer, and be strengthened by His Spirit to live in the present moment of each new day in the light of God's love for us in Christ. So - whatever our hopes and fears for our world, our church and ourselves - here's a New Year prayer for us all, adapted from the words of St Paul in Philippians 4.5-07:

Lord, as we trust Your presence with us, help us not to be anxious about anything, but in every situation, to bring our prayers to You with thanksgiving. And may Your peace, which transcends all understanding, keep guard over our hearts and our minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
