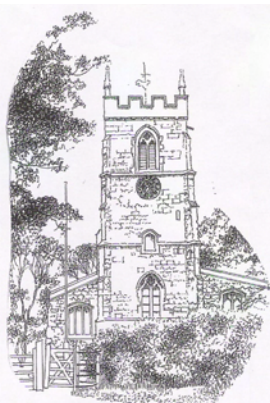

Trees

All residents are reminded that it is an offence to chop down any trees in a conservation area without permission—and that Scalford is a conservation area.

Should any work on trees with a trunk diameter of 7.5 cms or larger and/or a height of 1.5 metres or higher be required, six weeks' notice should be given to the Borough Council. The only exemption is the pruning of fruit trees, which should always be done according to approved horticultural practice.

SHOPMOBILITY MELTON MOWBRAY

A new Shopmobility Scheme has been set up in Melton Mowbray to help people with a disability who wish to access the pedestrianised town centre.

At present the scheme is based at Melton Tourist Information Centre in King Street, and the opening hours are Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10.00 am to 3.30 pm. St Mary's Way and the Bell Centre car parks are situated at the rear of the building.

Shopmobility Melton Mowbray has motorised scooters and manual wheelchairs which can be hired for 2-3 hours free of charge by members of the scheme (donations accepted). Registration is also free and takes only five minutes.

Booking is advisable and can be made by telephoning Shopmobility Melton Mowbray on 01664.480677 (mobile 07841.496732). If no-one is available, please leave a message and the coordinator will return your call.

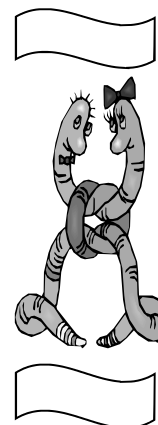
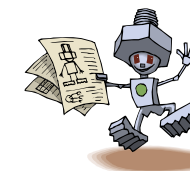
