THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND **ELECTORAL ROLL**

very six years each church is asked to scrap its previous electoral roll and start a new one. The electoral roll is a list of people who feel they 'belong' to their local or chosen church. This is usually because they attend regularly, but can also be because they support the church by helping with projects or giving financially.

All those on the electoral roll can vote at the Annual General Meeting, and to be on the Church Council you have to be on the electoral roll. The electoral roll is no longer used to assess the parish share, as some people think.

To be eligible for inclusion, you must fill out a form (even if you have previously done so); you must be aged 16 or over and be a member either of The Church of England or another Trinitarian Church, and be resident in the parish, or have habitually attended worship for the last six months at your chosen church.

Forms are available from the Electoral Roll Officer at each of our churches or from me.



This year Bishop Tim is coming on a short Holy Week Pilgrimage to our Deanery. He will be coming to take three services: Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Easter Day. The three services have been agreed so that Bishop Tim will be able to fulfil other engagements at Launde Abbey and in the city of Leicester. At the Churchwardens' Meeting, after a great deal of discussion, those present decided that one joint service would be a good and worthwhile experiment this Easter Day. The two services will be joined together by an Easter Breakfast.

1ST APRIL

Palm Sunday there will be a special service with 'donkey' procession at Somerby at 10.30 am. As the bishop would like us all to attend, there will only be an 8.00 am said communion that day in one of our churches (venue to be announced).

5TH APRIL

Maundy Thursday there will be a special ecumenical service in St Mary's Church at Melton. Again our services for Maundy Thursday evening will not happen this year.

8TH APRIL—EASTER DAY one for early risers!

The Bishop will celebrate communion in the open air at sunrise at Belvoir Castle. There will be access up to the castle forecourt for those who find walking difficult; the others will process up from the car park.

8.00 am Easter Breakfast at Waltham Village Hall. Tickets will be available.
 10.00 am United Easter Celebration of Holy Communion—Waltham Parish Church.
