Eastwell. The Council has been requested to supply an additional Dog Waste Bin which it is quite happy to do, but where to locate is difficult to decide. We would therefore ask local dog walkers in the area for their views on the most appropriate place. It is also intended to replace the existing bin with a new one, and hopefully move away slightly from its existing position.

Eaton. Following a recent survey of the allotments, the Council has decided it needs to address the whole issue of allotments, as plot numbers and tenancy agreements do not tally up in some instances. Initially it is intended to put a numbered marker on each plot so we all know where we are: this will then be checked against existing tenancy agreements.

One of the things that was discovered by the survey is that some of the plots have not been cultivated or looked after, as stipulated in the tenancy agreements. All tenants (where applicable) are therefore requested to see that their allotments are brought up to a reasonable level of tidiness.

It is not the Council intention to make changes to the allotments, but it is their duty to ensure that the area is kept in a suitable and tidy condition.


