999 Fire & Rescue Calls in the East Midlands

Fire and rescue service control rooms will have the ultimate back-up at times of high demand from a new initiative which launches in the East Midlands next autumn.

Over the next two years, the existing control rooms in Derbyshire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire and Nottinghamshire will gradually come together in a brand new building. Nine Regional Control Centres are being built across England, and the East Midlands centre in Castle Donington will be one of the first to 'go live'.

The centres will be able to provide a coordinated response to national disasters such as terrorist incidents, widespread flooding or a major fire. Whether an incident is 5 or 300 miles away, staff will be able to

scale-up their operations and provide support wherever it is needed.

The East Midlands control room operators will receive all 999 calls to fire and rescue services, will know immediately where the caller is ringing from and which fire appliances, with the correct equipment on board, can reach the scene most quickly.

The existing Derbyshire control room will be the first to transfer its calls towards the end of 2009; this will be followed, at intervals, by those from Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire and Northamptonshire, to complete by summer 2010.



What is Messy Church?

Who is it for?
