

HELP NEEDED TO FIND REGION'S RAREST CREATURE

Conservationists in Leics and Rutland have launched an appeal for help in a major survey aimed at finding out if one of Britain's rarest animals still exists in the two counties.

The Hazel Dormouse has been sighted in not Leicestershire since the 1970s and in Rutland since the 1990s. BELVOIR COMMUNITY FORUM 24th March 2009

Nearly 50 people met at Belvoir High School for the first Belvoir Community Forum meeting in 2009. One of 27 Community Forums which cover the County of Leicestershire, Forums are public meetings to discuss issues and services affecting local residents and recommend improvements. Senior officers from a wide range of agencies attend, including National Health Service, Police, Leicestershire County Council and Melton Borough Council. County Councillors, Borough and Parish Councillors are also invited. As well as key items each meeting, there is always a "question time" element, a genuine opportunity to raise concerns and get answers.

The forum in March promoted the range of provision of services and opportunities for young people in the Vale of Belvoir. Young people and other speakers described the current provision of youth clubs, including those run by the County Council Youth Service, as well as by Volunteers. Other items discussed included improving broadband services (speed and reliability) across the area. There was explanation about how public sector agencies are working together to improve community safety in Melton (involving using "Who wants to be a Milloionaire"- style voting handsets) and an update on plans for the next "Vale Fest", a programme of community-based arts and cultural acitivity. All in all, the Forum provided for an interesting and informative evening. More crucial is the development of a partnership-between local people and their representatives and officers—to take ideas and opportunities forward.

The next Belvoir Community Forum meeting will take place on Thursday 25th June, 7.00 pm, probably at Waltham (subject to confirmation).
