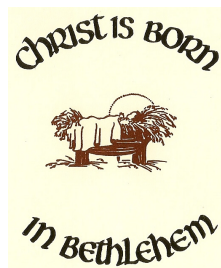

**Pimms Evening with the
Cantare Choir****A LETTER****from the Revd Canon Beverley Stark****An Autumn Away.**

A few years ago I sang We Plough the Fields and Scatter no fewer than 15 times as I travelled through our villages leading Harvest Festivals.

This year I didn't get to sing it at all. We were away on our Sabbatical Travels in the English Countryside and, despite seeing many posters advertising harvest events, we were never quite in the right place at the right time to attend a Harvest Festival. The nearest we got was a visit to a church where I used to be the vicar and they sang a completely new version of it—a version that was entirely appropriate for a church on an urban housing estate. It didn't matter that I would rather have sung the traditional version because I no longer belong there and they were trying to reach out to people who do (the church was packed!).

At the other end of the spectrum, we discovered as we travelled through Cumbria, Herefordshire, Suffolk and Norfolk that some places no longer celebrate harvest as no one is interested in attending (farming methods have changed and so has the composition of the village community).

Others have a service and no feast and some creative country parishes are trying to incorporate the traditional into new ways of attracting young and old into their church services. For instance, I liked the idea of a service on a Friday evening followed by a meal and social evening and the idea of having a Farmers Service with hymns chosen by the local farming community.

I am left wondering what brings people to our Harvest Festivals and what keeps them away? It would be a shame if Harvest Festivals, along with We Plough the Fields disappeared from our land.

If the services and events that we have at harvest don't 'plough your field' or 'scatter your seed', then tell us. Don't just stay away believing that these traditions will

simply keep going. They don't and won't. (This is just one of the hundreds of thoughts I have had during our time away!).

And so to Christmas ...

It has been such a good and productive time that Christmas has come into our lives with amazing speed. This Village News will be full of creative events and services as our local churches seek to serve their communi-



ties with opportunities to celebrate at this wonderful time of year. I hope that all people of faith, young and old will find something to their taste and will enjoy being in church this Christmas.

Even if you haven't been to church for ages, you will be very welcome.

And in the New Year

I am sure the experience of 3 months away from work responsibility will fairly soon become a distant memory as I take back the reins again and Harriet goes on her trip to India for 3 weeks. However, I know that the things I have learned will stay with me for a long time. Over the next few months I will try to share some of them with you.

I hope to see many of you over Christmas—after all, I missed you at Harvest time! As well as trying a service or two, why not wander into church by yourself and talk to God about faith and hope. Of course we can do that anywhere, as God is all around us, but most of us (including me) find the days go by and we haven't had the chance and time passes and our spirits get hungry for a taste of God's love and mercy. Find an open church or use the keypad at the back door of Waltham and Stonesby and go in and have a chat.

Have a very happy and blessed Christmas as we remember once again the birth of Jesus, God's loving gift to us—Jesus the Christ, our Saviour.

LONG CLAWSON MEDICAL PRACTICE PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP

Long Clawson Medical Practice has
recently established a Patient
Participation Group (PPG). This is a group
of patients who want to get involved with and
support the running of their local GP practice.
We have been discussing various issues with
the practice and would like to regularly
distribute information that might help you
understand the processes involved with your
care.

Question: Why does it take so long for my
repeat prescription request to be dealt with?

Answer:

It takes two days to process a written
prescription request. On a Monday and a
Tuesday there are up to 300 prescriptions with 900 items to deal with. A doctor has to sign
each one as this is a legal requirement. The following day the prescription is checked by the
pharmacist. It is then entered on the patient records on the pharmacy computer to produce
a label. The label then has to be cross checked against the prescription and the item selected
by the technicians. The prescribed items are then checked again by the pharmacist before
being released for you to collect. Again this is a legal requirement. It is a time consuming
process but the necessary checks ensure that you get the correct item and dosage.

Can I help?

Yes, if you regularly need to re order medicines. If it is practical and safe for you to do,
please consider re- ordering several items at a time rather than spacing out your orders over
the month. If in doubt please contact the surgery.
