From the Revd Canon Beverley Stark:

Happy New Year to all our readers! As I get older New Year, along with yet another birthday, comes by with startling speed. I cannot believe it's 2011. I've only just got used to writing 2010!

In all the local churches we are undertaking a project called 20/20. What will the church be like in 8 years time? Despite losing congregation who move or go into nursing homes or are 'Promoted to Glory' we have managed for the last few years to have stable attendance figures in all of our local churches.

Many rural churches are not so lucky, but congregations are getting weary of fundraising and building maintenance and despite very good financial support in several of our villages, none of our church buildings or indeed our church congregations is guaranteed to even be here in 2020.

Put alongside this situation a fast changing society in which regular commitment is difficult to find, and faith commitment for many is a step too far, and you can easily see why planning for Christian faith, life and presence and the continuing iconic presence of church buildings is being given such a high priority in our thinking and praying.

Of course you could say that this is/cont.

nothing to do with you. But I do feel that if too many people say this, then church in our villages will mean a very different thing in 8 years time and we will all be left wondering what went wrong.

What could you do to help? The church desperately needs all people of Christian faith to be actively involved in a faith journey in some way. How about starting this new year by getting our your diary or calendar and marking in it the Sunday each month when you will come to your church to worship - and if you are not sure about faith but want to help how about offering a couple of hours a month to help keep the ancient church building or churchyard in good order. Ring your local churchwarden if you would like to help.

When your number is up, you might find that when you meet with God in heaven he will be thanking you for keeping his church alive, and at that moment I promise you, you will be very pleased indeed that you learned to worship The Almighty in church on earth!

On the other hand, the Small Ads are free of charge (although donations are always accepted), and can be changed from month to month but please let me know if they become out-of-date.






