The NHS 111 service

The point of this new service is to provide a tree-digit, easily memorised number to access non-emergency NHS healthcare, that is, less urgent than 999. It will transfer you to the appropriate service including Out of Hours GP and will set up face to face appointments is necessary.

The calls are free to patient; the line is staffed by fully trained call advisors, supported by nurses; it operates 24/7, 365 days are year; and patients will be connected to the right service (there will be no need to call another number).

How does the service work? You ring 111; the call is answered and you will be asked a series of questions. An ambulance will be despatched automatically if a life threatening emergency is detected. If you need further assistance you will be transferred to the Out of Hours medical service. If you then require a doctor's appointment or home visit, this will be arranged. If you consent, your GP will be emailed consultation details.

A&E departments are always very busy at this time of year, and it is worth the phone call to 111 to find the best course of action. This could save time, an unnecessary journey, and get you treatment quickly if you need it. Reports from those who have used the 111 number have been positive.



Information Sharing

Every time you come and see us, we record the details of your consultation or treatment with your GP or nurse on our computer system. Every time you go to an A&E department or hospital, we receive a discharge letter which we also put on our computer system. If you are being looked after by any of the community health services. they may provide us with information which we put on our computer system.

We do everything we can to protect that information and your privacy: our computer system is only accessible by our practice staff and is both smart card and password protected.

Three initiatives to share your medical are about to begin:

- The Summary Care Record (SCR). This is a small sub-set of clinical information (medications, adverse reactions, allergies) which will be on the national NHS database alongside your name and address, and will be accessible by all hospital emergency departments.
- Health & Social Care Information Centre (HSCIC) uploads. This is an office of NHS England. They will be taking the entire clinical database from every GP practice in England on a regular basis; they will use this for national resource and service planning intelligence.
- Risk Profiling. This merges GP data with hospital data. The patient records are screened to assess their risk in being admitted to hospital in the future. Those who are viewed as being of high risk are highlighted to their practice and this helps your GP to take a proactive approach to your care.


