come****Dear Reader of the Village News,**

The season of harvest festivals is upon us. Over the coming weeks, the harvest hymn 'Come, ye thankful people, come' will doubtless be sung in many gatherings, as we give thanks to God for the food we have on our plates, and for those whose labour has helped to make it possible.

Yet how easy it is for us to take food for granted. Our generation is more removed from the land than any previous one, with a much greater proportion living in an urban rather than rural setting, and many people never see anything of farms and farming. Even those of us who live in the countryside can so easily drive past our local farms, and walk on footpaths through the fields, without appreciating all that is involved in bringing in the harvest.

It is vital that we cultivate an 'attitude of gratitude', and not just at harvest-time. Why? Because as we 'count our blessings', so we appreciate more fully 'all good gifts around us' (as another harvest hymn puts it), and take nothing and no-one for granted.

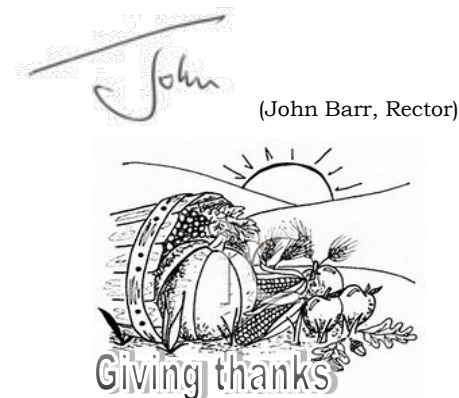
Living where we do, there is certainly much for which we can be thankful. We have such a beautiful landscape, one that has been shaped by centuries of farmers working on the land. Also, living close to Melton Mowbray, the 'rural capital of food', we should need no reminding of just how much food is readily available for us to eat in this country - and not just pork pies and stilton cheese!

Yet harvest-time can also highlight how the fruits of the earth are still not shared equally - some have far too much, while many others have far too little. In vast swathes of Africa, crop failure has led to malnutrition and even starvation. And in our own country there is a huge amount of food waste, while many suffer from food poverty.

Farmers themselves face many challenges working on the land - eg. low incomes, debt, bureaucracy, Brexit uncertainty, poor prices, rising costs, isolation, disease, and bad weather - pressure points that often cause great stress, and affect health and relationships. That's why organisations like the Farming Community Network (www.fcn.org.uk) are needed more than ever, as they seek to support farming people.

Perhaps this harvest-time, you and I might consider some way in which we can practically show our harvest 'attitude of gratitude' - both for the work of farmers, and also to provide help to those in other countries for whom there will be no harvest?

From the Revd James Skinner

*D*ear Friends,

This year it has been a summer of two parts. June was very hot and dry. July and August has been mixed with rain and cooler temperatures. I am now beginning to enjoy the fruits of the vegetable garden; the courgettes have been productive and the tomatoes are starting to ripen and the beans are just starting to crop. In the hedgerows, there is a profusion of blackberries and on the fruit trees plums and apples are ready to be enjoyed. All this reminds us of the earth's plenty.

As we enter the autumn season in September, we are regularly reminded of the earth's productivity. This is not true for everyone. The world continues to experience the effects of climate change, with drought and famine for some and floods for others. This week (15th August) we have been hearing about the mud slides affecting Sierra Leone in West Africa, where, following heavy rain, parts of the country's main city, Freetown, have been swamped. And now, on Saturday, we are hearing that the monsoon rains in Bangladesh and India have resulted in serious floods.

Climate change can't be ignored and we will increasingly experience more severe episodes in coming years, affecting the poorest people the worst. The decisions we currently make in how we choose to live will have far reaching consequences not only for us, but for generations to come.

The Bible reminds us that humanity is part of the created order, albeit a significant part. However, as creation provides us with the blessings of fruitfulness, humanity, too, should seek to be a blessing to the rest of creation.

When we come to our harvest celebrations over the next few weeks, let us be mindful of our responsibilities in looking after our world, so that we not only enjoy the world's goodness but ensure that it will continue to be able to provide all with blessings for years to come.
