

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

What will you do on New Year's Eve? Will you happily say goodbye to 2017 with relief? Or was it a year you enjoyed, full of happy memories?

Looking to the future is not something that all of us do with relish. Some may be looking forward to 2018 with new opportunities unfolding, others may be fearful of what may lie ahead. For me, this calls to mind the Christmas broadcast King George VI made in 1939, at the start of the Second World War, when he quoted Minnie Louise Haskins' poem, The Gate of the Year".

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown". And he replied: "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than any light and safer than a known way".

In the Methodist church we are blessed with many hymns that reflect on the passing of the old year and look forward to the new one. This hymn by Joseph Hart from the 18th century sums up how many Christians would approach the change of the year:

> 'Tis Jesus, the first and the last, whose Spirit shall guide us safe home; we'll praise him for all that is past, and trust him for all that's to come.

Another practice in the Methodist tradition since 1747 has been to renew our promises to serve God in whatever way he wishes to use us. John Wesley, the initiator of the Methodist movement, encouraged others to do this. It was a custom passed on to him by his mother from her Puritan father.

On 31st December Anglican churches from the Ironstone Benefice and the Methodist churches at Stonesby and Scalford will be meeting to share in renewing our promises to God. The service will be at Waltham Parish Church and start at 10.30 am. I shall be leading and the Revd John Barr preaching. All are welcome to be part of what has become a very meaningful occasion for Christians throughout the years.

I look forward to meeting you then, but if I don't - many best wishes to you all for 2018.




