Dog fouling is a problem for everyone, as generally no one ever sees the culprit do it or knows who the owner of the dog is. Nevertheless, it is an offence to allow a dog to foul the streets and should anyone by chance see it happen and know either the dog or the person with it, they should report the matter direct to the Borough Council. On the Borough website under the A-Z, go to D, and you will find dog fouling, with a link to make the report, which will be followed up by the Borough, who are the enforcing authority. Alternatively phone the Borough Council on 01664 502502 to report the incident. It is in everyone's interest to keep the streets of the village clean and free from dog poo.

Letter from the Rector

All you need is love....

Dear Reader of the Village News,

What does a day celebrating romantic love, and the start of a 40 day period of fasting and self-denial have in common? Not a lot, you might think. Yet this month, St Valentine's Day happens to fall on the same day as Ash Wednesday - 14th February - the day which marks the beginning of the Christian season of Lent.

For my wife Mary and myself, who will be taking part in different Ash Wednesday services, this certainly makes for an interesting combination! On the one hand, we will mark St Valentine's Day, as we give thanks for the love that we share with one another; and on Ash Wednesday we will also seek to express our desire to grow in the love of God, as we come to receive the imposition of ashes. As our foreheads are marked with the sign of the cross, some ancient words will remind us of our own mortality, and of our constant need of God: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ".

Sometimes we can think that Lent is about whatever we choose to give up - eg. chocolate, crisps, alcohol, coffee, or social media. While choosing to give up things - or else to take other things on - can be really helpful, this is not the main point of Lent. At its heart, Lent is about an invitation for us to discover more about what true love really looks like.

Whenever a couple come to be married in church, they make their vows to "love and to cherish" each other. They also go on to say the following to one another: "With my body I honour you, all that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you, within the love of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit".

These words speak of how love involves far more than romance. The love spoken of in a marriage service is love that involves total unconditional self-giving - and not just of the couple to each other, for their commitment is made "within the love of God".

It is as we commit ourselves to love one another that we discover more of God's enfolding love for us - the wellspring of all true love. So the season of Lent is an opportunity to spend time reflecting on how Jesus shows us what God's love looks like in person. It is love which involves total self-giving, even to death on a cross. It is also love that cannot be destroyed, and which has won a glorious victory - once and for all - over sin and death. For in Jesus, we come to know the wonderful truth of how, with God, "all you need is love".

The Book of Psalms, in the first part of the Bible, is a book to which many people have a strong affinity. This book contains a wide range of human emotions, from sublime thoughts about worshipping God, through to people's unkind and hateful thoughts about others.

The book has been a great source of inspiration throughout history and there are many hymns that are either based on psalms or where a line of a psalm is a starting point.

Modern living styles encourage us to live life at a fast pace, dashing from one thing to another. Spaces for being still and reflective are not usually part of the order of the day! In a previous appointment one church had a banner with these words:

Be still and know that I am God

Reflecting on fresh interpretations of the psalms drew me to a Japanese modern version of the Twenty Third Psalm: "The Lord is my Pace-Setter".

I shall not rush,
He makes me stop and rest
For quiet intervals.
He provides me with images of stillness
Which restore my serenity.

It is important that during our busy lives we do find time to be still before God - on Sundays, meeting with other Christians in Bible groups and in our own quiet moments. This does not mean that God is absent with us when we are busy, but it is important that

there are times in our lives when we are still and listen to what God may have to say to us and perhaps be surprised by what we hear.


The Lord is my Pace-Setter

MEASLES IS CIRCULATING

Measles is extremely infectious and can be serious. Make sure your children get two MMR vaccines on time; the first at 1 year of age and the second at 3 years 4 months. If you or your children missed these vaccines, it's not too late. Ask for the <u>free</u> vaccine from your family doctor.

If you have symptoms of measles, stay at home and phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice. STAY AWAY from GP surgeries and A&E departments - you could spread the illness to others. Symptoms include high fever, sore red, watery eyes, coughing, aching and feeling generally unwell: a blotchy red brown rash, which usual-

ly appears after the first symptoms.




