Letter from the Rector

*Letting go**Dear Reader of the Village News,*

It's hard to believe that it was a year ago that I first wrote to introduce myself to you - how time flies! Over the past ten months since Mary and I moved over here from Malvern, many people have asked us a similar question: "Are you feeling settled yet?" It has been asked in a friendly and caring way, in the hope that we are now enjoying our new life and surroundings. Yet I have found it hard to answer, because I still feel in the early stages of settling in.

Moving on from a place where you've put down deep roots, and away from people that you've grown to love, is a major upheaval. It involves many kinds of bereavement, and I have to admit that I found the experience of moving to be far more stressful than I had expected. Letting go isn't easy, is it?

However, whether we like it or not, letting go is something that all of us have to do, from the moment of our birth to the moment of our death. It may be the letting go of a familiar place when we move home or school, or of a familiar job and routine when we retire. It may be the letting go of our independence due to ill health, or of a loved one who has gone before us through the gateway of death.

Whatever experience it is that we have to face, letting go can be a real and painful struggle. The loss and sense of bereavement we feel isn't something that we can simply 'get over' quickly. Life is not the same again, and adjusting to our new circumstances takes time and patience.

Letting go is often hard. Yet we need to learn to do this, if we are to embrace the next stage of our life's journey, and be open to its possibilities. As we continue to journey through the season of Lent, and approach Holy Week and Easter, you and I are reminded that we are not the only ones who know what it is to let go.

For in Jesus Christ, we discover how God freely chose to let go of everything, because of His immeasurable love for us and for this world. In Jesus, ~God let go of His heavenly glory to embrace our earthly frailty, and by His death on a cross to embrace our experience of suffering and death. And Jesus did this so that you and I might be set free from all that enslaves us, including our own fear of letting go.

When we look to Jesus, we discover how letting go is the only way to open ourselves to share in God's own self-giving life. As Bishop John Taylor once put it in his book *A Matter of Life and Death* (SCM press 1986 p 65), "the choice for every human being is between death or death - the death of letting go that hurts like hell but leads to resurrection, or the death of slow extinction as all the energies are spent on getting and keeping, instead of living and giving".

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

The Church season of Lent is early this year, having begun on Valentine's Day (14th February).

Preparing for a service recently I was reminded that the word Lent is unique to this country. The word Lent is derived from an old English word meaning the spring season, the time of the year when the days lengthen. In some European countries, Lent is called the fortieth because it covers a period of forty days. In other countries it is known as the season of fasting.

The number 40 is significant in the Bible. The Jews, under Moses' leadership, took 40 years to travel from Egypt to Palestine. After Jesus was baptised he spent 40 days in the desert, fasting and praying as he prepared himself for his ministry.

Today Christians use the Lent season as a time of reflection. They recall Jesus' time of self-examination in the desert and look at their own lives, asking for God's forgiveness where they have failed. They remember, too

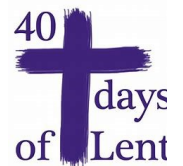
the last week of Jesus' life and the events that led up to his crucifixion on Good Friday. Christians also prepare to celebrate Jesus' resurrection at the feast of Easter, which comes at the conclusion of Lent.

Traditionally, Christians followed Jesus' example by fasting during Lent. In former days they would only have one meal a day, after sunset and without meat or eggs. Today, relatively few Christians fast, but they may give up something as a token, such as alcohol, chocolate, or social media. Others may do something extra like joining a group. The Rev'd John Barr and Deacon Dawn Canham are running a group during Lent for the Ironstone Benefice (details elsewhere), exploring how God is calling us to live in these times in the countryside.

Whatever we choose to do during Lent this year, let us use the time well and discover more about God and what he could do in our lives.

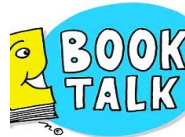



FROM CONFUSION TO
FUSION



THE STORY OF A GLASS ARTIST
BY ALI GROSCHI
