Letter from the Rector

"Thy Kingdom Come" ...

Dear Reader of the Village News,

According to a recent ComRes poll, more than half of all adults in this country still pray. Of those who pray, 55% will do so in a crisis and 71% pray for their families. Many now pray 'on the go' - 12% while exercising and 20% while cooking. Maybe for some of us preparing a meal, prayer for a successful outcome might be no bad thing!

One of the other interesting findings is that 39% of people surveyed believe that prayer can be world-changing. That reminds me of what Prabhakar Rao - a vicar from the church in India who was visiting our church in Malvern a few years ago - once said to us about prayer: "Prayer changes things".

Perhaps you would not be surprised to know that your Rector also believes that prayer is vitally important. Over the years, I have seen how prayer opens the door to blessing, and how it does indeed change things - including the person who is praying.

That is why I have now made it a daily habit to include each one of the seven Ironstone villages and churches in my own prayers - one for each day of the week - starting with Chadwell/Wycomb on Sunday and working round alphabetically to Waltham on Saturday. If you become aware of anyone - including yourself - that you'd like me to remember in prayer, please do let me know.

Each Wednesday morning at 9.00 am, there is a Service of Healing and Wholeness at Waltham, and Christine Alexander (email wee3alexander@btinternet.com) would be happy to receive any prayer requests for us to include at that service.

In what has come to be known as The Lord's Prayer, Jesus taught His followers to pray "Thy Kingdom Come". It is a prayer that God's Kingdom will come on earth, and that we might experience the fullness of God's blessing that has been made possible for us through Jesus Christ.

During this month - from 10th May (Ascension Day) to 20th May (Pentecost) - many churches will be joining in a global commitment to pray launched by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York.

As part of "Thy Kingdom Come" (further details on website www.thykingdomcome.global), there will be a 24 hour 'wave of prayer' for all our local communities in the Framland Deanery (Melton Borough area) taking place at All Saints Church, Asfordby, from 12.00 noon on Friday, 18th May to 12.00 noon on Saturday, 19th May - finishing just before the Royal Wedding and the FA Cup Final! If you'd like to find out more, or get involved, do let me know.

New GDPR Data Collection legislation**

You may be aware that there is new legislation coming into force on 25th May relating to data protection. Four members of the Benefice Council have recently been on training at St Martin's House, run by the Diocese, for implementing the legislation. If we re to contact you by phone, text or email, we now must have your consent.

In the next couple of weeks, the church wardens will be receiving a pack giving them information of the implementation of the legislation and forms for all recorded members of their church to consent to the Benefice being able to contact them. These forms need to be completed and returned to your churchwardens. Churchwardens in turn need to return these to Lisa, Parish Administrator, before 11th June - in time for the next Benefice Council meeting.

If you are not a regular member of the congregation but would like to be kept up to date with information about the Benefice, there will be spare forms you can collect from your church, or please contact your churchwarden.

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

As I write we are currently in election campaign for the May local government elections, when people will be standing for office. Jesus Christ refused to be drawn into the politics of first century Palestine, but he did challenge people to think about what values they lived by and how this not only affected themselves but others too.

Reflecting further, I was drawn to a book of sermons by Henry Drummond, a Scottish preacher and Evangelist in the second half of the nineteenth century.

In one sermon 'The Programme of Christianity' he begins with a boy's question: "What does God do all day?" Later, he comments that whilst God is in all kinds of churches, he does not wait there for people to come and worship him. Jesus did not give people religion, he came to give new direction to people's religious aspirations. Jesus was critical of many of his contemporaries because they only paid attention to religious observances and not what they did with the rest of their life. The off-duty priest did not help the person attacked on the Jericho road.

In the middle of May, it will be Christian Aid Week (13th to 19th May), with its theme 'Together we're stronger than the storms'

' - a timely reminder again of the inequalities and poverty that still continue in much of the world. The nearest thing that Jesus came to publishing a manifesto for how he wanted to change things, can be found in the record of his visit to his local synagogue in Nazareth, where he read these words from the prophet Isaiah:

*"The Spirit of the LORD is upon me,
for he has anointed me
to bring Good News to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim
that captives will be released,
that the blind will see,
that the oppressed will be set free,
and that the time of the
LORD's favour has come."*

Luke 4:18

Henry Drummond comments that during his life Jesus cared for people much more than he did for religion and religious organisations. As we think about the current news, the continuing issues of world poverty and which way we should vote in the upcoming elections, we might strongly consider looking at the world 'through Jesus' eyes', then act as he would have done.

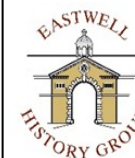

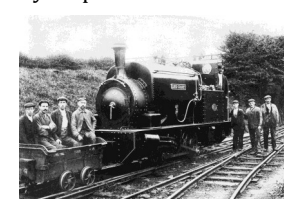
