

Letter from the Rector

Discovering Rural
Gems? ...

Dear Reader of the Village News,

Do you ever find yourself wishing that you could be in two places at once? This month, I find myself in that position on Saturday, 9th June, the day of the Waltham Summer Fair. Let's hope that the weather is rather warmer than we had last September - my first experience of the Waltham Charter Fair!

Alas, I am going to have to miss what's happening in Waltham, as I'm helping to organise (together with Mike Alexander) another event which is taking place that same day from 11.00 am to 4.00 pm over at Brooksby Hall.

Discovering Rural Gems is a family friendly day being run by the Diocese of Leicester, celebrating rural life, church and food.

During the day there will be a whole range of activities taking place in the lovely grounds of Brooksby Hall. Whether it is having a go at bell ringing, learning more about Forest Church or Mess Church, bouncing on the bouncy castle, enjoying lawn games like Giant Jenga, tucking into some lunch from the BBQ, spending time in the 24/7 prayer room, or meeting some of the Brooksby farm animals, there should be something for everyone to enjoy, to discover, and to be inspired by.

While there will be lots of things happening in different places at the same time (programmes and maps will be provided!), at 2.00 pm everything else will stop as we hold a big Celebration Service.

During this gathering for worship, Bishop Martyn will give a keynote address which connects with the themes emerging from The Rural Commission that he set up last year, *'Deep Wells and Green Pastures'*. This Commission, which has been chaired by the Dean of Leicester, David Monteith, will present its initial findings at seminars during the day, and Bishop Guli will also be reflecting on the theme. Further details about the programme for the day will be available on the Diocese of Leicester website (www.leicester.anglican.org).

Discovering Rural Gems is open to everyone, and people can come and go as they please throughout the day. There is no charge for entry or parking in the grounds (disabled parking will be provided near the Hall), and food and drinks will be available to purchase.

So if you're around the Brooksby area on 9th June, do drop in and enjoy the delights of this part of rural Leicestershire. Better still, how about visiting both Waltham Summer Fair and *Discovering Rural Gems*, and enjoy the double delight of these two Leicestershire rural gems ...?

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

This week (halfway through May), we were reminded that the football World Cup in Russia will be soon upon us, with Gareth Southgate naming the squad of players who will represent England.

Many of us have our views on football: who should be part of the team, where they should play and how they should play - but the one thing about football is that, whoever is chosen, it is a team game requiring everybody to play together and to play for each other.

Football has something in common with the Christian faith, as Christians also need to work as a team. St Paul, writing to the Christians in the Greek city of Corinth, pictures the way that a good church should operate and likens it to a healthy human body (1 Corinthians 12).

The human body is made up of different parts, all of which have their particular roles. However, if one part of the body does not fully function, the health of the whole body is impaired and it cannot operate effectively.

In church life there are many different tasks to be carried out to ensure that the Christian community works well and the challenge of bringing this about becomes more difficult when the number of

people available is small. This year members of the different Ironstone churches have been meeting together to discover how they can become meaningful Christian communities in their respective villages.

Now that this series of meetings has finished, the Rev'd John Barr (the Rector) and I are inviting Christians who live in, or worship in Scalford, to meet at the Methodist Church Hall on 18th July at 7.30 pm to explore how we can be a meaningful Christian presence in this village. The aim of the meeting is to see how we might use our resources in the most effective way and how we might become a coordinated team working together for God's work and for the good of the village community.

For a football team to work well together, the gifts of every team member need to be brought out. In God's work there are similarities: God's presence is most clearly shown when Christians fully use their gifts. John and I both hope that we can discover fruitful ways that all Christians in Scalford can do this.
