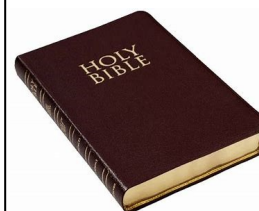

Letter from the Rector

*Through all the
changing scenes of life*

Dear Reader of the Village News,

For me, one of the greatest privileges of parish ministry is being able to share the journey with those who are experiencing major life events. Whether it is marking the beginning of Christian faith through the water of baptism, witnessing a couple committing themselves to love and cherish each other in marriage, or being with the dying and bereaved as they face death, such moments highlight what life is all about.

During this month, my wife Mary and I will experience one of the major life events from a different perspective than we are used to as Church of England clergy. Together with other family members and friends, we shall be gathering at Scalford Parish Church to witness the marriage of our elder daughter Rosie to her fiancé Matthew.

On this occasion Mary will be the officiating minister, while my role will be that of the father of the bride. As well as accompanying Rosie to the church (and hopefully ensuring that we get there on time!), this will involve a speech at the reception (I'd better try not to be too embarrassing or long-winded, or I'll be in trouble!), and sharing in the joy of the whole occasion with everyone else.

For most of us, life has many changing scenes. Some of these are full of joy and delight. Others are full of pain and sorrow. Yet whatever changing scenes of life we may have to face, I am convinced that one thing remains true.

From beginning to end, from the cradle to the grave, all of us are invited to discover how life is a God-given journey with a God-given destination, and how the key to it all is the love God shows us in Jesus Christ.

My prayer for Rosie and Matthew - and for us all - is that in the light of Jesus Christ we discover what life is all about. As St Paul puts it in the following prayer:

"I ask (God) to strengthen you by his Spirit - not a brute strength but a glorious inner strength - that Christ will live in you as you open the door and invite him in. And I ask him that with both feet planted firmly on love, you'll be able to take in the extravagant dimensions of Christ's love. Reach out and experience the breadth! Test its length! Plumb the depths! Rise to the heights! Live full lives, full in the fullness of God".

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

The British are notorious for talking about the weather! It does not matter what it is, either it's too dry, too wet, too hot or too cold.

The last month has been very warm and very dry. Every day, sometimes on several occasions, I have been in the garden watering just to keep plants alive!

Some people have been recalling the summer of 1976 and shortage of water that came that year. For the last two months I have been taking all the used water out from the kitchen to water the garden.

This year, the meteorologists tell us, has been one of the warmest in the north hemisphere; some places have been very dry, like parts of Africa, or very wet such as south western Japan which has had devastating floods. Water, too much or the lack of it, is a major challenge for people.

Water is mentioned in the Bible in several ways. There are the floods of chaos mentioned in the creation stories, the parting of the Red Sea as Moses leads his people to freedom, the river of life described in the book of Revelation

Water is important, too, as an agent that cleanses and brings new life to people. The most important way this is done is through baptism. Baptism is the sign that people now belong to God's family, the church.

Water can also be a picture of how God's power can reach every part of our lives. In St John's Gospel (chapter 4) there is a story about Jesus and his disciples travelling from Jerusalem to Galilee, a trip that took several days.

They come to a town in the district of Samaria and

stop by a well outside the town. Samaria was a difficult place to travel through as the Jews and the Samaritans did not get on and at times there was open hostility. Jesus waits by the well, while his friends go to find food.

A woman comes to the well to get water and Jesus asks her for a drink, leading to a wide-ranging conversation - from physical water to water as a picture of God's energy, reaching every part of us, to the woman's complex personal life, and even to where the right place to worship God is.

Thinking about water, Jesus' conversation with the woman reminds me of a song that begins with the words: "Have you heard the raindrops" and has a chorus "there's water, water of life, Jesus gives us the water of life ..." *

The final verse reminds us of how essential water is - both physical water and the 'water of life' that Jesus offers. August is a holiday month, so I do hope people have good weather to relax in, but that we also have some rain for our parched land and that we all experience something of God's water of life too.

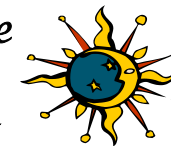

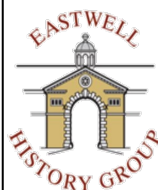
