**Bonfires and Smoke Nuisance.** The Council has received several complaints regarding smoke from bonfires and would point out that this comes under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 statutory nuisances, and carries a fine of £5,000.00 if convicted. Basic advice from Borough Council on bonfire smoke is to use common sense and consideration for neighbours, ie. don't burn wet material that will smoke a lot, don't light a bonfire where there is wind blowing towards residential properties. A leaflet giving more information is available from the clerk, and a copy will be on the Council website shortly.

**Public Rights of Way.** A reminder to anyone walking a dog on a Public Right of Way: you are required to keep the dog on a lead and, most importantly, to clean up after them.

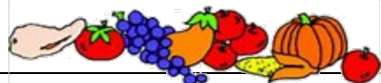

## Letter from the Rector

Dear Reader of the Village News,

The state of the environment is rarely far from the news. Whether it is the effect of heatwaves or earthquakes, hurricanes or floods, the growing evidence of global warming or the destructive impact of plastic pollution, the amount of food waste or concerns about the depletion of natural resources, our world is clearly facing an environmental and humanitarian crisis of unprecedented proportions. In the face of such huge global challenges, what on earth are we to do?

This month, many of the local churches are holding their annual Harvest Festival services. These are times when we can give thanks for "all good gifts around us", and count our blessings. The aim of the evening is to provide inspiration for personal, church or community projects which help to sustain and renew the life of the earth. ### Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

The hot weather this summer has led to many unexpected discoveries. In County Meath, Ireland, images captured by a drone amongst the dry grass have shown a previously undiscovered monument or henge close to 5,000 years old, measuring up to 200m in diameter, believed to be a late Neolithic or an early Bronze Age enclosure.

In Cumbria the ruins of the village of Mardale Green have been uncovered as Haweswater Reservoir has dried up in the heat. The reservoir submerged the settlement in 1935, after the valley was intentionally flooded to collect water; now it is possible to see the walls and shapes of the houses.

Nearer to Melton in Clumber Park, Nottinghamshire, on a large estate owned by the National Trust, a spectacular ghost of a building has emerged. The building that once stood on these imprints is Clumber House - a grand 18th century mansion demolished in 1938 after a series of fires. Rooms and corridors became visible as stone foundations left in the ground heated up more quickly than surrounding material, scorching the soil above to a lighter shade, according to Ben Mason at the National Trust. Although the mansion itself is not a new discovery, a previously unknown sundial in front of the lawn has been found.

Human lives can include things we would prefer to remain hidden. We don't always want others to

know everything about our lives. Some things which we thought were in the past can suddenly reappear - things which we hoped would remain hidden and that perhaps we are ashamed of: the unkind word, the unwise action, or just events we don't want others to know about.

St Paul, writing to his arguing friends at the church in Corinth, warns that when the Lord Jesus comes he will uncover the things that are now hidden and will even bring into the open the things we have not said but are just thinking about.

When things are uncovered there may be personal embarrassment or perhaps consequences to face. However, Christians believe that God provides a way back.

Last month I was listening to the disgraced politician Jonathan Aitkin on BBC radio. Having served a prison sentence for his failings, he spoke about his new role as a hospital chaplain and how he was now helping others using his prison experiences.

The hot weather may be uncovering surprising things this summer. However, there is nothing we do in our lives that can ever be hidden from God's searching light. What we do have, though, is the assurance that when we leave things in God's hands, we are provided with the power to deal with them.
