Letter from the Rector

From Minus to Plus ...



Dear Reader of the Village News,

Last month, I mentioned some of the things achieved across the Ironstone Churches during the past year. I included the releading of the Chancel roof at Goadby Marwood.

Alas, a few weeks ago, Goadby Marwood - along with several other churches in the local area - was the victim of lead theft. On the day it was discovered, I met at Goadby Church with one of the churchwardens, Neil Rogers, and the Archdeacon of Leicester, Richard Worsfold, to look at the damage.

As we discussed this, Neil expressed the hope that somehow good might yet come out of this awful situation - hope that the minus of the lead theft might be transformed into some greater plus, through the pulling together of the community in response to this distressing event.

From minus to plus, from evil to good, from despair to hope. As I write this article in mid -March, the Brexit debate in Parliament continues unabated, and the sense of widespread anxiety and frustration grows.

It now looks as if there will be no withdrawal agreement reached by 29th March and it is still unclear as to what the future shape of our relations might be with Europe. One can only hope and pray that any minus we experience through Brexit - including the deep divisions that have opened up on this issue - will be more than outweighed by the

plus of a clearer way ahead, and a brighter future for our nation.

This month, we remember the events of Holy Week, that led to Good Friday and Easter. It is the story of how God in Jesus Christ has come to transform the greatest Minus we all have to face into the greatest Plus that we could ever hope for. How the Minus of sin and death has been overcome by Jesus Christ, transformed by His death on a cross and resurrection from the dead into the Plus of forgiveness and new life.

From Minus to Plus. In a world which so often finds itself in the minus of Good Friday suffering, sorrow and death, how badly we need to hear the Easter message of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ.

As one of Jesus' first followers, Peter, would later put it: "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1.3).

Wishing you every Easter joy and blessing, in the light of that living hope in Jesus,



Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

The media is frequently dominated by sad news. Over recent weeks we have had a constant stream of sorrow from around the world: of people being killed and injured as a result of war and conflict; of the suffering caused by drought and storm - and just recently, the Sudan plane crash, the terrorist attacks in New Zealand and today in Holland.

How should the Christian respond?

For me, one of the most helpful passages in the Bible is Jesus' sermon in the synagogue at Nazareth, where he read and preached on words from the prophet Isaiah (Luke 4 : 14). Jesus identified himself as the bringer of good news to the poor; the liberator of the captives; the person who bound up the broken hearted; the bringer of joy to the sorrowful.

These are values which Christ's followers, too, are called to live. We can begin in our home communities where there are many sad and lonely people who need our love. Further afield the ways in which we can respond individually are more limited, but we can give from our own resources and through our prayers. The important thing is that we stand beside those who are suffering and do respond.

Christians are also called to face injustice and cruelty head-on as Jesus did. For those

following his way it may lead, as it did for Jesus, to suffering, even death. We live in a world where human self-interest is still a powerful force which needs to be confronted daily with the power of God's love.

However, we do not embark on this task in our own strength, but in the light of our Easter faith which shows how God, through Jesus, has defeated the powers of selfishness, wickedness and hate. This is the supreme message we can take to the world, together with practical help.

I conclude with the final verse of Brian Wren's hymn *Christ is alive let Christians sing.*

Christ is alive and comes to bring good news to this and every age, till earth and sky and ocean ring with joy, with justice, love, and praise.






