Letter from the Rector

'An Inconvenient Truth'?

Dear Reader of the Village News,

I wonder if you can recall the 2006 documentary film 'An Inconvenient Truth'? In it the former US Vice-President Al Gore spoke about the threat of global warming, and warned of its dire consequences for our human and natural environment.

Over the past few weeks, you may have seen how members of the *Extinction Rebellion* movement have also been protesting against climate change, loss of biodiversity, and the threat of ecological collapse.

Like Al Gore, they are seeking to stress the urgency of the situation we face, something that has been underlined by a recent vote in Parliament for the UK to declare a state of Climate Emergency. Again, programmes like David Attenborough's 'Climate Change - The Facts', have highlighted the critical state of our environment.

In all this, there is a growing consensus that our planet earth is facing a huge environmental and ecological crisis, one which has largely been caused by human carelessness and selfish greed. We may now have reached a tipping point beyond which, unless there is radical change in patterns of consumption, this world faces the threat of irreversible destruction.

What can we do? Given the scale of the problem, it is tempting to despair. Yet if we act together, there is still hope. That's the message of the United Nations *World Environment Day* which has been marked each

year on 5th June, since it was first held in 1974. This aims to raise awareness about specific environmental issues, and this year the focus is on air pollution.

What can we do? We can change our lifestyle choices - for example, what we choose to eat, how we choose to travel, what we choose to recycle. As Al Gore put it in the closing words of his presentation: "Each one of us ... can make choices to change that with the things we buy, the electricity we use, the cars we drive ... The solutions are in our hands, we just have to have the determination to make it happen".

For Christians, caring for planet earth should be an expression of our worship of God the Creator of all. It must also be an outworking of our Christian mission. As the 5th Anglican Mark of Mission puts it, we should "strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth".

Here in this part of rural Leicestershire, the *Greening Framland* initiative is now seeking to form a small group to encourage local churches and communities to work together to make a difference. If you'd like to find out more, or become involved, do let me know.

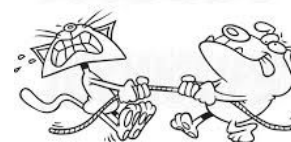
