Letter from the Rector

Remembering the Departed - Grief, Gratitude and God

Dear Friends,

How do we remember the departed - those who have left us and have now gone beyond the horizon of this life? For me, this question is particularly real and raw at the moment, as my mother has very recently died, and we shall be holding Mum's funeral in early November.

November is a month with a particular focus on remembering the departed - whether those whose lives have pointed us to God (All Saints Day - 1st November), our own departed loved ones (All Souls - 2nd November), and those who have died in the service of their country in time of war (Remembrance Sunday, and Armistice Day on 10th/11th November).

Death, however and whenever it comes, calls life and its meaning into question. It often leaves us struggling to make sense of what has happened, and our remembering can include a mixture of grief and gratitude.

In these early days of bereavement, I find it hard to go back beyond the most recent memories of seeing Mum struggle in living with dementia, and the harrowing experience of watching her physical decline to the point of death. Grief in the face of suffering and decline, loss and separation, are inevitable. And, as it has often been said, grief is the price we pay for love.

Yet alongside grief, there is also gratitude. Although my own memories are at present

overshadowed by events of recent days, I am also deeply grateful, as I think of Mum. I am grateful for the generous and unselfish love she shared with her family, for all her endearing qualities of character and deep-rooted Christian faith, and for those ways in which her nurturing care has helped to make me who I am. And it is my hope and prayer that in the days to come, it will be the many happy memories of the good times we shared together that will be the most fondly remembered and cherished ones.

Death confronts us with the mystery of life. What, if anything, lies beyond the horizon of this fleeting and fragile life? For the Christian, the answer is to be found in Jesus Christ. By His own suffering, death and resurrection, Christ has triumphed over sin and death, once and for all.

Through the Living Lord, we are assured that death is not the end, but a gateway to something far greater and more glorious than we can imagine. The gift of life with God in all its fullness, when "there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away" (*Revelation 21.4*).

Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends.

Throughout history, people have always tried to drag God in on their side in arguments and during wars.

There are many references to 'holy wars', like the Crusades to liberate the Holy Land in the 11th and 12th centuries, and the so called 'holy wars' between Catholics and Protestants in the 16th and 17th centuries. Today we hear the phrase 'holy war' used by militants in their conflicts against the West and Israel.

God does not wish to take sides in human conflicts. Human conflicts cause him much sadness. They are often the result of either broken relationships or of people's wish to go their own way regardless of anyone else. God's wish is for people to be reconciled both to Himself and to each other.

God has shown the seriousness of his intentions through coming to this world as Jesus Christ, a peace maker, sharing what it is to be a human person, even to the point of sharing our death.

Christians believe that through his death and resurrection, the power of God's love, shown during his life, came out triumphantly. John Oxenham in one of his hymns expresses well the purpose of Christ's mission on earth.

In Christ there is no east nor west In him no south or north But one great fellowship of love Throughout the whole wide earth.

Singing the Faith 685 John Oxenham, pseud (1852-1941)

Remembrance Day is when we call to mind those who have died during the two world wars and the many wars and conflicts since. But let us also remember the power of God's love to heal human relationships that have been broken by conflict. Not only that, let us,

too, become God's peace makers and agents of his reconciling love in the world today.


