Letter from the Rector

Time's Paces ...?

Dear Friends,

How do you view the start of a New Year?
For me, the turning of the year is a reminder
of just how quickly time passes.

I can remember my parents often saying that
time seems to go quicker as you get older, but
I didn't really pay much attention. After all,
when I was much younger, there seemed to be
all the time in the world. Now, at the start of
2020 during which I am due to mark a
'significant' birthday (the 'new 40', so they
say!), I understand more what Mum and Dad
were getting at!

One of my predecessors as Rector was some-
one who also understood how time seems to
speed up as you get older. Canon Henry
Twells, who was Rector of Waltham from
1871 until his retirement in 1890, wrote the
following poem called *Time's Paces* which was
published in his book *Hymns and Other Stray
Verses (1901)*.

When as a child I laughed and wept,
Time crept.
When as a youth I waxed more bold,
Time strolled.
When I became a full-grown man,
Time RAN.
When older still I daily grew,
Time **FLEW**.
Soon I shall find, in passing on,
Time *gone*.
O Christ! Wilt Thou have saved me then?
Amen.

From a Christian perspective, life is a precious
gift from God who calls us to live it in the light
of Jesus Christ. As we look to Jesus, and seek
to follow the Living Lord day by day, so we
discover more about life's true meaning and
purpose. And in doing so, we can play our
own part in bringing the Christ-light of hope
to a world that needs to know it more than
ever.

Revd Canon Henry Twells (1823-1900)

Canon Henry Twells was an Anglican clergyman, hymn
writer and poet. His best known hymn "At Even, ere the
Sun was set", has been described as one of the most
popular as well as one of the most beautiful of modern
hymns - and his best-known poem appears above.

He was born in Ashted, Birmingham, was educated at St
Peter's College, Cambridge, and served as Rector of
Waltham on the Wolds from 1871 to 1873.



Letter from the Revd James Skinner

Dear Friends,

January is a month that looks both ways. It
gets its name from the Roman god Janus, who
was believed to have two heads; one looking
backwards to the year that had just finished
and one looking forward to the new year just
beginning.

The month of January is seen by some as a
very quiet month after the festivities of
Christmas, yet there is lots to reflect on at the
start of the twenty twenties.

In Melton Mowbray much new development
is planned, including more new housing and
the start of the eastern relief road, which may
impact on the villages surrounding the town.
Nationally, there are many new things too.
There is a new government with new poli-
cies, including the departure of the United
Kingdom from the EU.

The clearest encouragement I find as a
Christian as I look forward to a new year is
from some of the hymns we sing in worship.
Sidney Carter's song "One more step along
the world I go" has the refrain:

*And it's from the old I travel to the new;
Keep me travelling along with you. ¹*

Whatever the new year may hold - things we
look forward to or things that we dread - we
need to keep in step with our God in both our
personal and national lives, as we travel into
it.

Another well-known hymn is "The Lord's my
Shepherd", a paraphrase of the 23rd psalm.
These days there are many settings of these
well-known words - from the traditional to
the more modern. The psalm has twin recur-
ring themes of God's guidance and of the be-
liever's trust in God to lead him/her through
whatever lies ahead. This is shown clearly in
the chorus of Stuart Townend's setting:

*And I will trust in you alone,
and I will trust in you alone,
for your endless mercy follows me,
your goodness will lead me home. ²*

As we set out into 2020 and the new decade,
let us not seek to journey alone but in God's
company as we face the challenges of our
time: of peace, justice, and climate change.
May we travel ready to seek the best for all
the human race and not just our own inter-
ests.

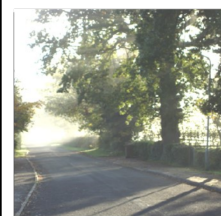

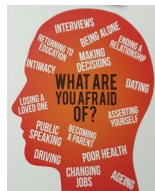
