If, like me, you have ever wondered what the small tree to the right is just before you go out through the lychgate in Waltham churchyard, then wonder no more, as the answer is coming up!

It looks like a dwarf horse chestnut with impressive cream coloured flower spires in the summer and is called *Aesculus Parviflora* - common name Bottlebrush Buckeye. It's native to

southeastern USA - found around Georgia and it flowers in July and August, unlike the earlier Chestnuts. It does bear fruit later, small beech nut shapes.

Aesculus parviflora is known for attracting bees and other pollinators. It has nectar/pollen rich flowers and provides shelter and habitat.

Many thanks to Gill Flood of Waltham who tracked down the info on this somewhat rare tree.
