Letter from the Rector

Lamenting loss

Dear Friends,

As we consider the present state of our world, there is much to lament. All over the world the present pandemic continues to wreak havoc, especially amongst the most vulnerable.

Many are also suffering as a result of human violence and conflict, greed and injustice.

And it is not just people who are suffering - as the COP26 Conference in Glasgow makes clear - climate change is having a profound impact on all the inhabitants of planet earth. Our world is experiencing loss in so many different ways.

During this month of November, we also remember the loss of lives dear to us on All Saints Day and All Souls Day. Later in the month, on Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday, we remember the loss of millions of lives laid down in the service of their country in conflicts past and present. As we think of how so many young lives were sacrificed in time of war - the flower of different generations prematurely cut down - we lament the abiding loss that this represents.

Lamenting loss is important. In doing so - by whatever way in which we give expression to our sense of loss - you and I acknowledge that we are part of a broken and suffering world.

As St Paul describes it in his Letter to the Romans, we share in creation's present state

of "groaning as in the pains of childbirth". But as we lament, do we do so in despair or in hope?

I wonder if you've come across the Old English word "respair"? It means "the return of hope after a period of despair". In the Bible we find many examples of how lamenting loss in prayer helps those who are suffering to make the journey from a dark place of pain, fear and sorrow to somewhere where the light of hope can get in.

Christians believe that the light of this hope shines for us and our groaning world in Jesus Christ. As we look to Jesus, and remember His own suffering, death and resurrection, so we receive assurance that God is never distant, and shares in our lamenting of loss.

For in Jesus Christ, God shows us that suffering and death is not the end - either for us, or for this beautiful but broken world. In St Paul's words, through Jesus Christ we are given "hope that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God".
