## Letter from the Rector

### Answering God's call ...

Dear Friends,

We are living in testing times. As we navigate our way through - and hopefully soon out of - the pandemic, we now find ourselves being confronted with other challenges.

For example, rising inflation has affected the cost of food and fuel, and many households on lower incomes are facing real food and fuel poverty as a result. This means that some are having to make an awful choice between whether to eat, or else to keep warm.

Choices are not always easy to make, are they? Sometimes factors beyond our control really limit our choices, as is the case for those faced by food and fuel poverty. Yet many of the choices we make - sometimes even without being aware of it - can also say something about us, and about where our real priorities lie.

In JK Rowling's book *Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets*, the Headmaster of Hogwarts, Professor Dumbledore, reminds Harry of the importance of choices when he says that 'it is our choices, Harry, that show what we truly are, far more than our abilities'.

At the start of this month, on Ash Wednesday (2nd March), we mark the beginning of the season of Lent. Over the coming weeks leading up to Holy Week and Easter, Christians are encouraged to reflect on what really matters in the light of Jesus Christ, and what motivates the choices that we make.

We recall how Jesus also learned through the choices He had to make. During a time of testing in the desert, the Gospels tell us how Jesus was faced with testing choices. Choices that went to the very heart of who He was, and what He understood God was calling Him to do (Matthew chapter 4, verses 1-11; Luke chapter 4, verses 1-13).

We are living in testing times. Although many things are out of our control, you and I still do have a fundamental choice to make. It is the choice as to how we respond to what happens, to those challenges which confront us.

From a Christian perspective, the litmus test is surely whether our decisions are motivated by love of God and neighbour, or whether they are selfish and unloving. One way or another, our choices will show what really matters to us. For, as Jesus has said: "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew chapter 6, verse 21).

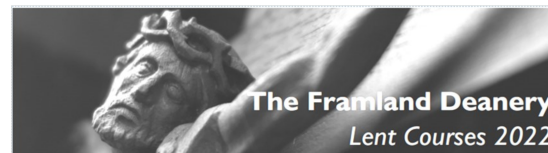




