Letter from the Rector

Choices, Hope and The Power of Love ...

Dear Friends.

choices we face in testing times, none of us hurricane of fate. The love we share knows could have imagined the impact of the no boundaries or walls. It is our life. There choice made by President Putin and the will come a day that we will be able to live Russian authorities to invade Ukraine.

That decision has led to war, and we can see the destructive effect in the daily news - so many lives now overshadowed by fear and anxiety, separation and loss, suffering and death. Whole cities are being razed to the ground - just as they were in Syria - and millions of refugees have fled from their beloved homeland. Over just a few weeks, one fateful decision has changed so much.

In the face of such human injustice and evil. it is tempting for us to despair. Where, then, is any hope to be found? Perhaps we need to look at nature, which shows us that after winter comes spring. We see signs of new life appearing around us, signs that speak of fresh hope. And - if we look beyond the depressing news headlines there are also stories of hope to be found, even in the midst of terrible suffering.

One example is that of the Zaghari-Ratcliffe family, who were separated for six years by Nazanin's detention in Iran. Who could not be moved by the sight of her seven year old daughter Gabriella rushing to hug her mother, or by the extraordinary courage and dedication of her husband Richard who had campaigned so tirelessly to secure his wife's return home?

As their MP Tulip Siddig has remarked: 'he showed us what love really means'. Back in 2017, from Evin Prison in Tehran, Nazanin wrote this to Gabriella: 'Forgive me for all the nights I was not by your side to hold your warm little hand till you fall asleep. ... You, When I wrote last month about those I and your father will never succumb to this anew all the days of our life'.

> During this month, the events of Hoy Week and Easter speak of how Jesus shows us what God's love really means - a love that knows no boundaries or walls. suffering and death on a cross, and then rising to new life, Jesus has triumphed over evil and death, and by His Spirit the Risen Lord enables us to share in His victory.

> In the dawning light of Easter, you and I are assured that there is healing beyond our present suffering, for God's new lifegiving love cannot be destroyed even by death.

> Wishing you and yours every blessing in the God-given hope of Easter,
