### **Letter from the Rector**

# Caring for others in a time of crisis ...?

Dear Friends.

The cost of living crisis is affecting so many aspects of our lives. Whether it is the soaring price of petrol at the pumps, rapidly rising energy bills, or the increased cost of staple food items in the supermarkets, the impact of inflation is felt everywhere.

However, it will be especially hard for those who have least, as low income households have to spend a far higher proportion of income on food and energy. And in rural areas such as ours, the rising cost of travel will be keenly felt by many.

The cost of living crisis - like the pandemic, and climate change reminds us that we live in an interdependent world, where what happens in one place affects others far away. For example, the war in Ukraine is affecting global food supplies, and the resulting sanctions on Russia are affecting energy supplies and prices. We delude ourselves if we think that we are really independent of others.

In the face of the present crisis, you and I may feel there is little that we can do, apart from looking at savings we might make to our household budgets. Yet there are things we can do in our local communities to share resources, such as transport. And we could support Melton Storehouse (www.storehousemelton.org.uk) by donations of food.

We could also support the work of the locally based *Melton and District Money* Advice Centre, which provides help in dealing with debts (www.madmacmoney.co.uk).

Again, we can play our part in encouraging our elected representatives (such as our MP, Alicia Kearns www.aliciakearns.com) to work for #legislation which targets Government support to those who are most affected by the cost of living crisis.

Those of us who profess to be Christians should need no reminding that our call to care for others flows from our Lord's command to love our neighbour as ourselves.

In the Bible, we see again and again how God is passionately concerned about justice, and how God calls us to show special care for the most vulnerable in our society. That is the way of true blessing, for it is as you and I care for others that we reflect God's love and care. As Jesus says: "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me". (Matthew, chapter 25, verse 40).


