**Letter from the Rector****Thirsty ground, and wellspring of life ....**

Dear friends,

Over the past few months, there has been very little rain in our area. While other parts of the UK - Scotland and Northern Ireland included - have had more rainfall, Central and Southern England has seen much less than usual. Water rationing has been introduced in some areas (e.g. hosepipe bans).

The first half of this year has been the driest in England since 1976, and this prolonged spell of dry weather has affected the timing and quality of the harvest gathered by farmers. The impact has also been evident in our gardens - eg. Sun-baked ground, and dry brittle grass.

Perhaps by the time you read this, the situation will have changed; but even so it will certainly take a considerable amount of rain to replenish the depleted reservoirs, and to soften the hard, dry ground.

While we may grumble at having to be more careful in our use of water, other parts of the world are faring so much worse. For example, many parts of Africa (eg. The Horn of Africa) are experiencing the worst drought for many years. This has led to famine - food shortages made even worse by the war in Ukraine which are now affecting global food supplies. Such prolonged hot dry conditions are believed to be closely connected with the impact of climate change.

Our land is thirsty. Yet I wonder when any of our churches last prayed for rain? In the Book of Common Prayer, there is the following prayer for rain:

*O God, heavenly Father, who by thy Son Jesus Christ hast promised to all them that seek thy Kingdom, and the righteousness thereof, all things necessary to their bodily sustenance: Send us, we beseech thee, in this our necessity, such moderate rain and showers, that we may receive the fruits of the earth to our comfort, and to thy honour; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

In the dry and thirsty lands of the Bible, rain is seen as a God-given blessing. And it is also a picture of the spiritual blessing that God longs to give when people turn away from their foolish ways, and seek to return to the Lord.

Christians believe that as we turn to Jesus Christ, we find in Him all we shall ever need to soften our hard hearts and quench our spiritual thirst. Jesus says this to all who hear His voice and come to Him in faith: "Whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life"! (John 4.14).

As the world moves on from Covid, we find ourselves struggling with other problems. Let us remember the people of Ukraine - off the front pages, but still struggling; or the cost of living which comes as hard reality to many; or the drought and hunger in parts of Africa. These are worldwide conundrums, but here in Scalford we have our own worries.



One thing which perhaps came out of Covid was that humans need company, but they also need peace - quiet time to reflect and think. Over shutdown the school in our village used the churchyard for the younger children to go to and have some 'time'. The older children are able to go to the allotments.

Together with the help of generous local businesses, we have hung up bird feeders, put up nesting boxes, positioned hedgehog houses, put out a water tray, built insect hotels and provided two benches. These are not only to encourage our natural world and our understanding of it, but also to provide a quiet place for all, whatever your age or inclination, to go and sit and have time for yourself.

The churchyard is a surprisingly diverse place with much history (family and past goings on), birdlife, bats, vegetation, small animals and insects. We are lucky to have the area so well looked after by the Parish Council and you are all invited to use this space. Go either way round the church building and take a few moments to appreciate the quiet area you will find. Give yourself a few minutes (and the church is open most days if it's wet).
